## Steven L. Cook Retires after 20 Years

Steven Cook formally announced his intent to retire as Superintendent of Haslett Public Schools, effective August 31, 2024.

## New Inclusive Playground Equipment Installation at Elementary Buildings (June 2024)

During the 2022-23 school year, a special committee was formed to look at inclusive playground equipment to be installed at the three elementary schools of Murphy Elementary, Ralya Elementary, and Wilkshire Early Childhood Center.

The committee looked at various inclusive playground equipment configurations and decided they wanted a large inclusive play center that was accessible and appealing where children of all abilities would feel welcomed and could play together. The committee also chose equipment that would provide children with just the right challenge to meet them where they are.

During the 2023-24 school year, the committee determined that at each elementary school one large piece of inclusive equipment would be installed, along with two or three smaller pieces. The District is excited to announce installation of the new inclusive playground equipment will begin in June 2024.

The inclusive playground equipment that has been chosen will support and enhance cognitive, physical, and social-emotional development. The playground equipment will also be safe and accessible to all children.

Haslett elementary children will be able to explore, use their imaginations and participate in creative play. The equipment chosen will have inclusive seating areas that will provide a place for children to take a break, socialize, and engage with others.

The new equipment also features wide ramps and pathways, which will ensure easy access for children with mobility impairments. The ramp incline will be kept to a minimum to allow children in wheelchairs to safely ascend and descend.

The District’s plan is to install the same equipment at both Murphy and Ralya Elementary Schools. The playground equipment at Wilkshire Early Childhood Center will be slightly different to account for developmental appropriateness. Most of the playground equipment that is currently at the three elementary buildings will be left intact.

We cannot wait for the children to return to school in August and have the opportunity to play on the new equipment. Children will feel included and find success on an inclusive playground. Each individual child will be able to access a playground that strives to remove barriers and enhances their physical, social, and emotional well-being. *Structure renderings of the new playground equipment can be found on page 3 of this publication.*

It is once again time to offer appreciation and best wishes to another exceptional senior class. Each graduating senior has shared their own unique voice and talents with their classmates and with Haslett Public Schools for the past 13 years.

The Haslett High School Class of 2024 has distinguished Haslett Public Schools with its academic achievements. Three seniors earned a 4.0 cumulative GPA: **Della Dillon**, **Ganga Murali**, and **Ian Opel**. Eighty-four seniors (48%) have maintained a 3.5 Grade Point Average or better.

**Ian Opel** was recognized as a National Merit Scholarship Commended Student. The DAR Good Citizen Award, which recognizes the qualities of dependability, service, leadership, and patriotism, was awarded to **Keagen Leeman**.

**Helena Czekalski** received the Art Scholarship Alert Honorable Mention Award, and she will receive her Gold Award from the Girl Scouts of America this summer.

**Ian Claassens**, **Sartaj Gill**, and **Ian Opel** have been involved in Robotics since elementary school. They have been part of Haslett Robotics Club and have earned spots in the Vex Robotics State Championship and the World Championship in all of the last four years. All three seniors competed in the World Championship in Dallas in April 2024.

**Keagen Leeman** served as the captain for the Varsity Quiz Bowl Team, and **Evan Benard** was a top 10 scorer in both the fall and winter CAAC Tri-County League and was named to the 2nd All-State Team at the 2024 State Tournament held at Michigan State University.

Haslett Media Production senior **Charlie Lott** received 1st place for his Sports Promo/Hype Video at the Michigan Interscholastic Press Association Awards ceremony.

The 2024 Senior Class contributed to the school culture in many ways. They represented Haslett High School with honor. They performed solos and harmonized their voices as part of the Choral Program and perfected performances as members of the Marching and Symphonic Bands.

In addition to the Arts, senior men and women excelled on the playing fields and courts throughout the district and beyond. Soccer, Lacrosse, Track and Field, Baseball, Softball, Basketball, Football, Tennis, Swim and Dive, Ice Hockey, Bowling, Cross Country, Volleyball, Gymnastics, as well as Golf and Wrestling occupied many hours for this group of young people.

In Band, at the MSBOA State Solo & Ensemble Festival, **Cecelia Coady** earned a first division rating for a bassoon solo, **Raymond Zhu** earned

a first division rating for a saxophone quartet, and **Dominic Knapp** earned a second division rating for a trumpet duet. Also, **Cecelia Coady** auditioned and performed in composer Kevin Day's All-Star Band as part of the Western Michigan University's Spring Conference on Wind and Percussion Music.

In Choral Music, the seniors led Select Ensemble, Men's Ensemble, and Chorale to Division I ratings at the District and State Solo and Ensemble Festivals. A student-led group (Fermatas) was chosen to be part of the Top 20 Ensembles in Michigan as a result of their state performance. Seniors in Chorale led the group to their performance at the Michigan Music Conference for the MSVMA Choral Hour.

## Summer School Enrichment Opportunities...

Haslett Public Schools is excited to offer summer enrichments for our students again this summer. These programs are designed to address academic needs and support student achievement.

### Summer School Enrichment

This summer school enrichment program is an in-person format and will be facilitated by district teachers, paraprofessionals and/or retired teachers, college education majors, and teaching assistants. The primary focus will be on Language Arts and Mathematics skills using research-based interventions. It is free to students who meet the following criteria:

#### Option 1 - Criteria (Grades K-5):

Summer School Enrichment for grades K-5 will be available for students who receive Title I support and Special Education services, as well as for students who are not progressing at the expected rate and/or are needing extra support in the areas of Mathematics and Literacy/Language Arts.

#### Option 2 - Criteria (Grades 6-8):

Summer School Enrichment for grades 6-8 will be available for students who receive Special Education services, students who took strategies classes, or students who failed one or more classes.

#### Option 3 - Criteria (Grades 9-12):

Summer School Enrichment for grades 9-12 will be available for students who receive Special Education services. Students receiving ESY (Extended School Year) Special Education services

will also have summer enrichment opportunities during the same time as summer school, with an additional week beginning August 5, 2024.

Summer School Enrichment is scheduled for three weeks from 8:30 AM through 11:30 AM (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday), beginning June 10 and ending June 27, 2024. No classes will be offered during the month of July. Tutors will have access to district-adopted curriculum and materials to enhance student skill sets.

### Credit Recovery (Grades 9-12)

This in-person program is available and free to Haslett High School students. The program allows students to complete credits to meet graduation requirements.

Certified teachers and paraprofessionals will be available to assist students in understanding the content and completing the required coursework.

These classes are available Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8 AM through 3 PM during the following weeks: June 10 (soft start after exams), June 17, June 24, August 5, and August 12, 2024. Students who need to attend Summer Enrichment will be contacted by the Haslett High School office.

## Integrated Pest Management (Advisory to Parents/Guardians)

Dear Parent or Guardian:

State of Michigan law requires that schools and day care centers that may apply pesticides on school or day care property must provide an annual advisory to parents or guardians of students attending the facility.

Please be advised that Haslett Public Schools utilizes an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) approach to control pests. IPM is a pest management system that utilizes all suitable techniques in a total pest management system with the intent of preventing pests from reaching unacceptable levels or to reduce an existing population to an acceptable level. Pest management techniques emphasize sanitation, pest exclusion, and biological controls. One of the objectives of using an IPM approach is to reduce or eliminate the need for chemical applications of pesticides. However, certain situations may require the need for pesticides to be utilized.

As required by State of Michigan law, you will receive advance notice regarding the non-emergency application of a pesticide, such as an insecticide, fungicide or herbicide, other than a bait or gel formulation, that is made to our buildings or grounds during this school year. Notification is not given for the use of sanitizers, germicides, disinfectants, or anti-microbial cleaners. In certain emergencies, such as an infestation of stinging insects, pesticides may be applied without prior notice to prevent injury to students, but you will be notified following any such application.

Advance notification of pesticide applications, other than a bait or gel formulation, will be given by at least two (2) methods. The first method will be by posting at the main entrance of the building. The second method will be by posting information on our website.

Please be advised that parents or guardians are entitled to receive the advance notice of a pesticide application, other than a bait or gel formulation, by first class United States mail postmarked at least three (3) days before the pesticide application, if they so request. If you prefer to receive the notification by first class mail, please contact the District Operations office at (517) 339-8242.

Parents or guardians of children attending Haslett Public Schools may review the district's Integrated Pest Management program and records of any pesticide application upon request.
