### THE GRADING SYSTEM

Grades are awarded numerical as follows:	
A =	93-100
B =	85-92
C =	75-84
D =	70-74
F =	Below 70

Grades are recorded numerically on report cards and transcripts. Pitman High School is accredited by the New Jersey State Department of Education.

### WEIGHTED RANKING SYSTEM

1. Numerical average is the means of calculating class rank rounded to 3 decimal places.
2. Rank is based on academic subjects only. These include courses taught by the English, World Language, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies departments. Non-academic subjects such as Business, Fine and Industrial Arts, Physical Education/Health, Music, and Vocational Education are not factored into class rank.
3. Weighting of AP and Honors courses is as follows:  
Five GPA points will be added to the final average in honors courses and ten GPA points will be added to the final average in AP courses. The weighted grades will be used for ranking purposes only and will not appear on the student's transcript or report card. No weight will be added for failing grades in Honors or AP courses.
