<u>August</u>

- IF YOU ARE APPLYING TO 4 YEAR UNIVERSITIES open up a Common App account and <u>link</u> your Naviance account
- o Complete resume on NAVIANCE

Using Naviance in the College Application Process

Naviance is a comprehensive and widely used college and career planning software program that will assist our students in various areas such as career exploration, personality assessments and post-secondary planning.

All students are given access to Naviance. The counselors have assigned grade level appropriate tasks to each student during their classroom lesson.

To log into Naviance

- 1. Go to the Wallkill Senior HS website
- 2. Click on the Naviance Link on left side of page
- 3. Or Single Sign on from your Chromebook

What to remember for using Naviance

The following tasks MUST be completed online through Naviance

- 1. Request for transcripts to be sent to the colleges to which you are applying.
- 2. Request teacher recommendations, if needed. Remember that not all colleges require teacher recommendations. If you do not know if a college you are applying to requires a teacher recommendation, call their admissions office to ask them.

Option 1: Common Application- Colleges will automatically be added to Naviance

- By August 1, 2019- Open up a Common App account at www.CommonApp.org OPEN ONLY ONE ACCOUNT- multiple accounts will delay the application process!
- 2. Enter High School Information, add at least ONE college, and Sign the FERPA Release Authorization on the Common App
- Complete the Common App account matching process in Naviance. (See video on the bottom of Naviance Home Page) MATCH YOUR COMMON APP AND NAVIANCE ACCOUNT: https://www.naviance.com/resources/entry/how-to-match-your-common-app-and-naviance-accounts
- 1. Request materials for college applications in Naviance (Teacher recommendations/transcripts) (on next slides)

Option 2: Applying directly to the college or via the SUNY application

- 1. Log onto the colleges website or the SUNY application and apply
- 2. Log into your Naviance and add your colleges:

Adding College Applications in Naviance:

How to add schools:

- 1. Under the "Colleges" tab click "Colleges I'm Applying To"
- 2. Click the + button to add colleges
- 3. Complete Steps 1 and 2 for every school you want to add

How to Request a Transcript through Naviance

- 1. Click Colleges tab- "Colleges I'm applying to"
- 2. Click the box to the left of the college(s) you wish to request transcripts for
- 3. Click "+ REQUEST TRANSCRIPTS"
- 4. Click on Initial Transcript
- 5. Click "REQUEST and FINISH"

Letters of Recommendation

Most colleges/universities require letters of recommendations from your teachers. We suggest that students ask for at least two letters of recommendations from teachers that know them well. You should also follow up with a thank you note.

Step 1: Ask your teacher for the letter of recommendations. If yes, move to step 2

Step 2. Give your teacher a copy of your resume (log onto Naviance, click on About Me tab, click resume) and your transcript along with a thank you note stating the following:

Dear Mr. Smith,
Thank you very much to agreeing to write a letter of recommendation on my behalf.
Attached, please find my <u>RESUME</u> and my transcript for your reference. My intended major is ______. Please upload my letter on Naviance and email a copy to my counselor.


How to Request a Teacher Recommendation

It is very important that you ask your teachers in person first before sending them a request through Naviance.

- Click on the "Colleges" Tab
- 2. Scroll down to "Letters of Recommendation" on left
- 3. Click on "Add Requests."
- 4. Select a teacher from drop down
- 5. For question 2, always choose the first option
- 6. Include a personal note (deadline, thank you, etc.)
- 7. Submit request
