LEARNING SNAPSHOT

Year 1 have been learning to tell the time on analogue clocks! They have enjoyed learning about half past and o'clock! They have also been working really hard on their class assembly this week and did a lovely job learning and reading their lines! We are so impressed!

Ask Me: What do the hands on the clock mean?







Year 2 enjoyed their day in Year 3 on Monday and painted beautiful self-portraits with their new teachers. They have shared their home-learning about Coastlines. There was also much excitement in the class this afternoon as the first butterfly hatched from its cocoon.

Ask Me: What did you enjoy about your new classroom?







Year 3 went to Kew Gardens yesterday, via public transport. The children were absolutely amazing, representing the best of behaviours of Eton Porny! Travelling via trains, we had a great time looking after each other and playing games whilst looking at the changing landscapes from Windsor to Kew. We had a great time taking part in an Artistic education session, from picking different colours visible in the garden to drawing with oil pastels and making patterns using botanical plants on the grounds.

Ask Me: what was your favourite part at Kew Gardens? Was it the train journey, the greenhouses or the education session?



Year 4 started their week with a day in reception. They loved returning to where many of their school journeys began: playing with water and sand as well as enjoying time with their friends. Later in the week the children took part in a 'Maths Morning' with Nathan Crook. Nathan Crook is one of the top maths consultants in the UK. Year 4 worked on place value to thousandths and fractions. He was very impressed with their Maths knowledge. This week all of the art projects have been completed and various clay tiles and statues have been sent home.

Ask Me: Name some equivalent fractions to 1/2.



Reception have been continuing our maths learning all about subitising, recognising quantities without having to count. So far we have been practising subitising using dot patterns and die frames, but this week we have introduced a rekenrek, which supports children with their subitising skills as they explore the structure of small numbers. The children have enjoyed using language like 'reds and the ready' and 'one push' as they begin to get used to pushing all the beads just once. The children will continue to use the rekenrek and similar language to support their subitising when they move into Year 1.

Ask Me: how do you use a rekenrek?


