PURPOSE: To provide for information the 2010-2011 annual testing results for the district. Included in the report are the results of the ABCs of North Carolina and the adequate yearly progress (AYP) results as part of the federal legislation from No Child Left Behind.

BACKGROUND: Each year, the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction and the State Board of Education approve and release the annual testing results for performance on individual school's performance designations under the North Carolina ABCs of Public Education accountability model and on AYP, a measure required on the federal No Child Left Behind legislation.

North Carolina ABCs results – Orange County Schools had six schools make High Growth and six schools make expected growth. This year, five of the district's schools were designated as "Schools of Distinction". Students in grades 3-8 achieved overall high growth in reading and mathematics. Other highlights of the North Carolina ABCs include:

- Four-year trend data reflects improved performance composite at 11 schools.
- The district posted gains in 14 of the 18 tested areas with one area – Grade 7 Reading remaining the same.
- The high schools showed gains in all five end-of-course test results
- Science results in grade 5 showed overall improvement while results in science at grade 8 dropped slightly.

No Child Left Behind AYP results – The 2010-2011 school year was the year where the targets set by the state for determining AYP were raised sharply – in reading from 43.2% to 71.6% and in mathematics from 77.2% to 88.6% for grades 3-8. In 10th grade, the targets increased from 38.5% to 69.3% in reading and from 68.4% to 84.2% in mathematics.

Under these new targets, the district met 41/58 or 70% of their target goals. Two schools made AYP – Hillsborough Elementary and Pathways Elementary.

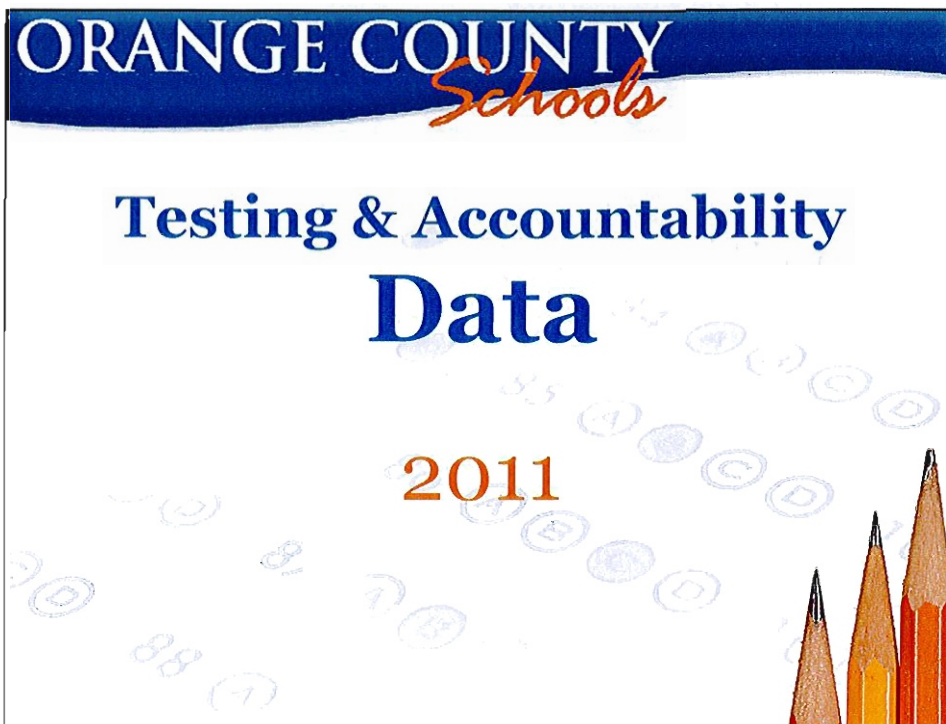
Statewide and across the nation, the number of schools making AYP dropped sharply. First passed in 2001, the NCLB legislation has been scheduled for reauthorization since 2007. As a result, many high performing schools have been labeled as failing under federal standards.

Graduation rates for the 2010-2011 school year were 82.8%, a slight decrease from the preceding year of 83.1%. The district rate continues to surpass the national rate of 71.7%. At this time, the 2010-2011 North Carolina graduation rates have not been released.

Disaggregated student data will be presented at a future Board meeting in the early fall.

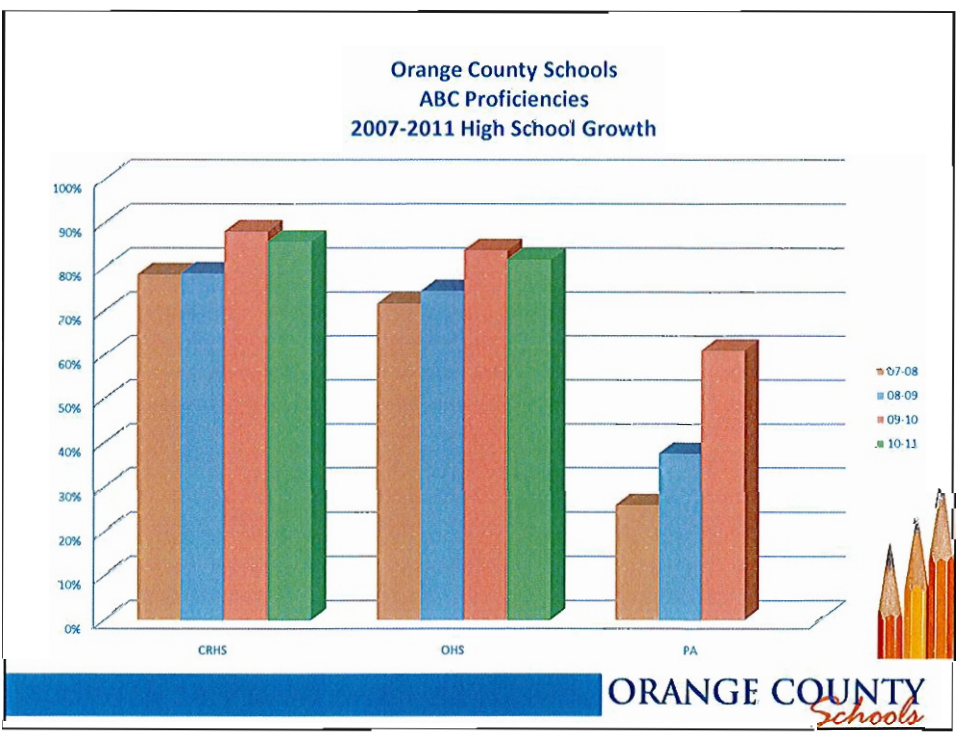
