






Who is the number 1, most important person, most influential person in your child's academic success?





When families are engaged, everything is better.

- Parent involvement fosters better student classroom behavior (Fan & Chen, 2001; NMSA, 2003)
- Parents who participate in decision making experience greater feelings of ownership and are more committed to supporting the school's mission (Jackson & Davis, 2000)
- Parent involvement improves school attendance (Epstein et al., 2002)
- Parent involvement increases support of schools (NMSA, 2003)


- Ask your child's teacher if there is something you can help with (in-person or remote).



- 4. Understand teacher's expectations



SHARED DECISION MAKING



Look for and ask about opportunities to be part of school-based decisions.

- OCS Policies <u>LINK</u> & <u>Policy 1310 Parental Involvement</u>
- School Improvement Plans <u>LINK</u>
 - Goal 4: The school will develop a stakeholder listening system for each stakeholder group (students, teachers, families, community members) to listen, monitor, report, and translate current as well as future valid needs and requests into priorities for improvement.

OCS Principals' Top 11 for Families



- Check your child's PowerSchool regularly (grades 6-12)
 Check your child's planner regularly (K-5)
- 2. Celebrate your child's successes and coach them when things aren't what they had hoped for.
- 3. Join the PTSO, PTSA, PTO, Booster (Boosters at high school include athletics, band, theatre, arts, choir, etc.) to connect with other parents.

OCS Principals' Top 11 for Families

- 4. Attend students' school games and performances.
- 5. If you have any questions or concerns, email or call your child's teacher or any school staff immediately. We are here to help!
- 6. Read the weekly messages from your child's school.
- 7. Advocate for your child.

OCS Principals' Top 11 for Families

- 8. Make sure teachers know the best way to get in touch with you.
- 9. Read with your children.
- 10. Encourage your child to participate in clubs and activities outside of the regular school day.
- 11. No matter your child's age, stay involved.
