**Apportionment for Local Food for Schools Funds  
Fiscal Year 2022–23**

This apportionment, in the amount of \$23,071,364 is from funds provided by the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) and authorized under the CCC Charter Act [15 U.S.C. 714]. State allocations were provided to the California Department of Education (CDE) to alleviate supply chain disruptions in the School Meal Programs. Awards from the CDE are provided to eligible school food authorities (SFA) who submitted an attestation to receive the Local Food for Schools (LFS) funds.

Eligible SFA recipients are public school districts, county offices of education, charter schools, private nonprofit schools, tribal schools (such as those administered through the Bureau of Indian Education), and Residential Child Care Institutions participating in the USDA National School Lunch Program (NSLP) or School Breakfast Program (SBP) in School Year 2022–23.

**Purpose of Funds**

The purpose of the LFS funds is to provide relief to SFAs that have experienced widespread and unprecedented challenges in purchasing and receiving food for school meals through their normal distribution channels. Supply chain issues have significantly impacted an SFA's ability to procure nutritious foods for NSLP and/or SBP meal service.

The LFS funds are a critical source of funding that provides an additional financial resource for SFAs to purchase local domestic, unprocessed or minimally processed food products with the goal of strengthening California's food systems by providing funding specifically for the procurement of foods from a local, regional or in-state farmer, rancher, or producer with an emphasis on those that are a small business and/or a socially disadvantaged business.

**Allowable Expenditures**

The LFS funds must be used exclusively for the purchase of local domestic food products that are unprocessed or minimally processed for use in school meal programs, specifically the NSLP and SBP.

Examples of allowable food products are:

- Fluid milk
- Cheese
- Yogurt
- Fruits and vegetables (including 100 percent juices)
- Grain products such as pastas and rice
- Meats (whole, pieces, or food items such as ground meats)
- Beans
- Legumes
- Foods in a wide variety of minimal processing states (e.g., whole, cut, pureed, etc.) and/or forms (e.g., fresh, frozen, canned, dried, etc.)

Incidental costs (such as those related to shipping and handling or packaging) that are a part of the normal or customary purchase price charged by a vendor for any given food product are also an allowable use of LFS funds. LFS funds may only be used for current/future expenses.

### **Funding Amounts and Financial Management**

The amount awarded to each SFA is based on a predetermined formula which includes two components: a base payment of \$5,000 to all eligible SFAs, and a proportional funding amount based on each SFA's share of statewide student enrollment.

The LFS funds must be deposited into the nonprofit food service account of the SFA for which the funds were intended. LFS funds may only be used for the purposes for which they are awarded.

The CDE will disburse the funds in two increments. To minimize potential hardship on SFAs, the CDE will make an initial advance payment of 80 percent of the funding to each participating SFA, with the remaining 20 percent of funds to be distributed as a reimbursement contingent upon full and accurate completion of the required reporting indicating proof of allowable expenditure of LFS funds.

### **Procurement Guidelines**

At minimum, SFAs must follow all applicable procurement processes and guidelines, which may include, but are not limited to:

- Complying with all existing recordkeeping and review requirements per Title 7, *Code of Federal Regulations (7 CFR)*, 210.9(b)(17) and 7 *CFR*, 210.18, which includes maintaining documentation demonstrating appropriate use of the funds.
- Complying with all applicable federal procurement and financial management requirements per Title 2, *CFR*, 200.

### **Reporting**

Eligible SFAs who opt-in to this program are required to submit procurement documentation and a purchasing timeline to receive the initial payment and provide quarterly progress and financial data reports on actual purchases to ensure program goals are met. SFAs are required to retain supporting documentation that demonstrates how these funds were expended. Supporting documentation must be consistent with the regular program recordkeeping requirements.

### **Expenditure Deadline**

LFS funds must be expended by March 2024.
