**ACTION ITEM**

This appointment shall be made at a meeting prior to the day fixed for the election and the appointee shall be seated at the organizational meeting. (Education Code 5328) When an appointment is being made because of a failure to elect, the County shall publish a notice once in a newspaper of general circulation. This notice shall state that the Board intends to make an appointment and shall inform persons of the procedure available for applying for the appointment. (Education Code 5328.5)

The following is a suggested timeline to make a provisional appointment to fill a "failure to elect" vacancy on the Governing Board, Trustee Area 1

August 18, 2022	Pursuant to Education Code 5090, a vacancy is declared when there has been a "failure to elect," meaning that the County Registrar of Voters has determined that an election will not be held because either no candidate or an insufficient number of candidates have filed to run for a Board seat(s). Education Code 5328 authorizes the Board to make an appointment in such circumstances.

The notice shall also include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the name of the provisional appointee, the date of the appointment and a statement notifying voters that unless a petition calling for a special election (pursuant to Ed Code 5091) is filed in the office of the County Superintendent of Schools within 30 days of the provisional appointment, it shall become an effective appointment.</li> </ul>
