Health Advisory
Issued due to Butte County Camp Fire Wildfire Smoke

Outdoor activities in Yuba County should be cancelled until further notice
School Officials should restrict student outdoor activity. Public Health
Department recommends indoor recess

Yuba County Public Health is issuing a health advisory notice for all Yuba County residents and schools due to the continued smoke and poor air quality from the Butte County Camp Fire.

Sutter County Health Officer, Dr. Michael Kinnison, is recommending all outdoor gatherings and sporting events in and around Sutter County be cancelled until further notice. Dr. Kinnison is acting as the interim Health Officer for Yuba County as well. Dr. Kinnison, recommends cancelation of after school outdoor activity events and avoiding student outdoor activity. Recess should be restricted to light indoor activities.

The Sutter County Health Officer warned that smoke generated by the Camp Fire can pose significant risks to health. As of 12:00 pm on 11-13-18 air quality in Sutter and Yuba County is very unhealthy.

While all persons may experience varying degrees of symptoms, more sensitive individuals, such as the young, aged and those with respiratory conditions are at greatest risk of experiencing more aggravated symptoms. Symptoms may include, but are not limited to, coughing, watery and itchy eyes, and difficulty breathing. Persons experiencing questionable or severe symptoms should seek professional medical advice and treatment.

Any Sutter County resident may obtain a N95 respirator mask by going to the Sutter County Public Health Department at 1445 Veteran's Memorial Circle, Yuba City. Yuba County residents may obtain a mask by going to the Yuba County Health and Human Services office at 5730 Packard Avenue, Marysville. Hours of operation are 8:00 am until 5:00 pm Monday through Friday.

County officials will continue to monitor air quality in Sutter County and provide updates on this advisory as needed. For current information about Air Quality and Wildfire Smoke:

In addition, residents who see or smell smoke should consider these precautionary measures:

- Healthy people should delay strenuous exercise, particularly when they can smell smoke.
- Children, teens, pregnant women and elderly people should consider avoiding outdoor activities, particularly prolonged outdoor exertion. Parents of children involved in youth sports programs should consider whether their children be allowed to participate when smoke is in the air.
- People with health conditions, including heart and lung conditions and diabetes, should remain indoors.
- Keep windows and doors closed as much as possible. Use the recycle or recirculate mode on the air conditioner in your home or car. Avoid using whole house fans and swamp coolers.
- Cloth and ordinary face masks do not provide any protection against the hazardous very small particles in wildfire or wood smoke. Well-fitted dust masks or "N95" respirators may provide some protection if exposure is unavoidable, but are much less effective protection than limiting activity and smoke exposure. People with health conditions may not be able to use masks or respirators – check with your doctor first.
- Keep airways moist by drinking lots of water. Breathing through a warm, wet washcloth can also help relieve dryness, but does not filter out the hazardous smoke particles.
- Avoid the fire areas.
