**RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE YUBA COUNTY OFFICE OF
EDUCATION ADOPTING THE OFFICE’S APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR THE 2017-18
PURSUANT TO ARTICLE XIII B OF THE CALIFORNIA CONSTITUTION (GANN
INITIATIVE)**

WHEREAS, in November of 1979, the California electorate did adopt Proposition 4, commonly called the Gann Amendment, which added Article XIII-B to the California Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of that Article establish maximum appropriation limitations, commonly called “Gann Limits,” for public agencies, including school districts; and

WHEREAS, the County Office of Education must establish an actual Gann limit for the 2017-18 fiscal year and an estimated Gann Limit for the 2018-19 fiscal year in accordance with the provisions of Article XIII-B and applicable statutory law; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does provide public notice that the attached calculations and documentation of the Gann limits for the 2017-18 and 2018-19 fiscal years are made in accord with applicable constitutional and statutory law;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board does hereby declare that the appropriations in the Budget for the 2017-18 and 2018-19 fiscal years do not exceed the limitations imposed by Proposition 4;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent provides copies of this resolution along with the appropriate attachments to interested citizens of this district.
