RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE YUBA COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION ADOPTING THE OFFICE'S APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR THE 2017-18 PURSUANT TO ARTICLE XIIIB OF THE CALIFORNIA CONSTITUTION (GANN INITIATIVE)
WHEREAS, in November of 1979, the California electorate did adopt Proposition 4, commonly called the Gann Amendment, which added Article XIII-B to the California Constitution; and
WHEREAS, the provisions of that Article establish maximum appropriation limitations, commonly called "Gann Limits," for public agencies, including school districts; and
WHEREAS, the County Office of Education must establish an actual Gann limit for the 2017-18 fiscal year and an estimated Gann Limit for the 2018-19 fiscal year in accordance with the provisions of Article XIII-B and applicable statutory law; and
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does provide public notice that the attached calculations and documentation of the Gann limits for the 2017-18 and 2018-19 fiscal years are made in accord with applicable constitutional and statutory law;
AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board does hereby declare that the appropriations in the Budget for the 2017-18 and 2018-19 fiscal years do not exceed the limitations imposed by Proposition 4;
AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent provides copies of this resolution along with the appropriate attachments to interested citizens of this district.
