Nominating Assembly Member James Gallagher for the California School Boards Association Outstanding Legislator Award

WHEREAS, Assembly Member James Gallagher represents the residents of the 3rd Assembly District. The district includes Butte, Tehama, Yuba, Sutter, Glenn, and Colusa Counties; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Member James Gallagher was elected to the California State Assembly in 2014; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Member James Gallagher has an extensive resume of public service prior to his election to the State Assembly. Prior to his election, James proudly served his community as a member of the Sutter County Board of Supervisors. During his tenure there, he worked on a multitude of regional committees that have given him exposure to numerous issues facing his constituency. His leadership and outside-the-box thinking helped in implementing public pension reform, streamlining public services and fees, and heading the effort to improve our levees and protect citizens from devastating floods; and

WHEREAS, during the last three years serving as a State Assembly Member, James has fought hard for continued Future Farmers of America funding and has been a strong advocate of Career Tech Education (CTE). In 2016, James introduced and had signed by Governor Brown AB 2063, which makes it easier for high school students to participate in career technical education (CTE); and

WHEREAS, Assemblyman James earned his Bachelor of Arts Degree at UC Berkeley, where he was Editor-in-Chief of The Patriot, a nationally recognized conservative news magazine, and was elected to the student senate. Upon graduation, he served in the prestigious Assembly Fellowship Program in Sacramento. During the program, he gained experience in state government, and worked on issues ranging from increasing timber harvest to improving our community college system. Upon completion of the fellowship, he obtained his law degree from UC Davis, graduating at the top of his class. Gallagher is a partner in his family's farming business as well as a practicing attorney, focusing on agricultural law; and

NOW, therefore, be it resolved that the Yuba County Board of Education hereby nominate Assembly Member James Gallagher for the California School Boards Association 2017 Outstanding Legislator Award.

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS OF THE COUNTY OF YUBA DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the governing board of Yuba County Office of Education, in order to comply with the requirements of Education Code Section 60119, held a public hearing August 10, 2016 at 4:30 p.m., which is on or before the eighth week of school (between the first day that students attend school and the eighth week from that day) and which did not take place during or immediately following school hours; and

WHEREAS, the governing board provided at least 10 days notice of the public hearing posted in at least three public places within the county that stated the time, place, and purpose of the hearing, and;

WHEREAS, information provided at the public hearing and to the governing board at the public meeting detailed the extent to which textbooks and instructional materials were provided to all students, including English learners, in the Yuba County Office of Education; and

WHEREAS, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each pupil has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home; and

WHEREAS, sufficient textbooks and instructional materials were provided to each student, including English learners that are aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks in the following subjects:

Mathematics English/Language Arts Social Studies Science See Attached; and

WHEREAS, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials were provided to each pupil enrolled in foreign language or health classes; and

WHEREAS, laboratory science equipment was available for science laboratory classes offered in grades 9-12 inclusive. Laboratory materials were purchased and/or made available as needed for lab classes; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Yuba County Board of Education and Yuba County Superintendent of Schools, do hereby resolve that for the 2017-2018 school year, the Yuba County Office of Education has provided each pupil in Harry P. B. Carden School with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks.
