

Music Program Thrives through Passion and Community

Northridge Schools' grades 6-12 music program has experienced significant growth and success under the leadership of band director and Northridge alum Mr. Alex Healey. The program begins in 6th grade and includes two middle school bands (6th grade band and 7-8th grade band), a high school concert band, jazz band, and marching band.

Since graduating from Ohio University in 2021 and returning to teach at Northridge, Healey has overseen the band's growth from 50 students to an impressive 150 students today. This spring, the high school concert band participated in the Ohio Music Education Association (OMEA) large group contest for the first time in the school's history and received a Superior rating in class B, the highest marks a school can achieve.

"Watching kids find themselves in music, create a community, and make beautiful music together is incredibly rewarding," said Healey.

Of the 12 graduating seniors in the High School Concert Band, five are continuing their music studies in college. Among them is Lydia Oney, who is following in Mr. Healey's footsteps by attending Ohio University to study Music Education. Reflecting on her experience, Oney said, "The music program has meant the world to me as it has always been a fun and safe environment to be yourself while being able to make music with friends. It also provides the ability to learn new skills and leadership opportunities."

The stadium construction is progressing rapidly, with a ribbon-cutting ceremony scheduled for August 12. The turf field is complete, the grandstands are built, and the scoreboard is up. Summer projects include completing the concession stand, concrete walkways, gravel under the grandstands, fencing, and play clocks. We look forward to cheering on Northridge Vikings in the 2024-2025 school year!





Update from Britt Lewis, Treasurer/CFO

The Northridge Local Schools' financial forecast remains stable. Revenue projections have increased from the November forecast due to the district's conservative budgeting with property tax collections. The continued growth within our community, combined with increased revenue projections, has enabled us to maintain fiscal responsibility, especially since most of our funding comes from local sources. We are deeply grateful to our community for their ongoing support, which



allows us to provide the quality education our community expects.

Our current facility projects, the District Stadium and Middle School Plumbing renovations, remain on schedule and within budget, with anticipated completion dates in August 2024. We commend our Athletic Boosters for raising \$1.6 million to-date toward their continued \$2 million goal, significantly contributing to the overall \$8 million cost of the stadium. Once completed, the stadium will be a wonderful addition to our community's athletic and marching band programs.

I am also proud to share that our district recently received its eleventh consecutive clean audit and ninth Auditor of State Award for 2022-2023. This honor is awarded to districts that meet all the criteria for a "clean" audit.

Northridge Local Schools remain committed to financial transparency and accountability while providing the necessary resources for our students' success. None of this would be possible without the support of our Northridge community. Thank you!
