
CONSERVATION DAY

FFA'S IMPACT ON OUR SCHOOL

West Canada Valley's FFA chapter has had a great impact on its school, such as educating other students and providing opportunities for its members to learn more about agriculture and everything it encompasses.

For the past five years, FFA has been "stampeding" classrooms with a life-size model horse, cow, and goat that are repainted every year by Mrs. Treen's animal science class.



For one week out of the school year, students buy tickets from FFA members and write the names of teachers they want to have surprised with the animals. Then, without the appointed teachers knowing, the animals are moved into their classroom. A new teacher is selected each day that week.

Most teachers enjoy and look forward to this event. "It brightens my day to have a bunch of farm animals in my room," says high school English teacher, Ms. Blynt. "I like that they're redone every year. It's educational," says high school Math teacher, Mrs. Goggin.



Other teachers have been taken off guard by the animals. New history teacher, Mr. Shearer, recalls his first time being stampeded. "All I see is this figure of a face in my room at 6:30 in the morning." He was so startled he says he punched the locker behind him. That face was none other than a fiberglass cow.

The elementary school looks forward to the stampede, too. "The elementary looks for the horse every time we move them," says Mrs. Treen, FFA advisor and agriculture teacher.

In addition to surprising students, FFA also educates elementary schools about agriculture. This year, FFA went to Poland Elementary school on Halloween to make pumpkin pie in a cup with their students.

They also went to our own elementary school to teach second graders about the life cycle of a strawberry plant.

Dustin Shannon-Dineen, treasurer of our FFA chapter, read I love Strawberries by Shannon Anderson to them. "Reading to the elementary students is always really fun because they are really good at listening and paying attention and answering questions," he says. "I feel like it has a great impact on younger kids because it introduces them to...leadership and FFA itself and agricultural stuff."

Dustin says being in FFA helps with leadership skills, working together as a team, and communicating with other people more. Through FFA, he has learned to be a kind and respectable person and a lot about life in general.

Her favorite part was the fun night, where she and her fellow FFA members from all across the state danced and played games. She had a lot of fun at the sessions as well, where state FFA officers gave their retiring addresses and more dancing and games ensued.

BAND PROGRAM EARNS TOP HONORS

This weekend the WCV Bands headed back to Sherburne to defend their 2023 Class Champion title. This year, the HS Wind Ensemble, MS Concert Band, Marching Band, Jazz Ensemble, Colorguard, and Drum Line competed at the 75 th Annual Sherburne Pageant of Bands on Saturday, June 1 st . Schools were placed in classes according to their high school's student population. Classes ranged from A (Medina Central School) all the way down to D (Laurens Central School). West Canada Valley was placed in Class B along with Bainbridge-Guilford, Dolgeville, Oppenheim-Ephratah-St. Johnsville, Marathon, and Waterville.

The WCV Wind Ensemble (grades 9 – 12), under Mrs. Shane Bonney's direction, received first place honors in the high school Concert Band category. The Small Ensemble, under the direction of Mrs. Bonney, received first place honors in their respective category. The Color Guard was awarded first place, under the direction of Mrs. Bonney. The WCV Jazz Ensemble, under the direction of Mr. Scott Bonney took second place in their category, performing three pieces of literature. The WCV Drum Line, under the direction of Mr. Bonney, received second place honors in their category. The Marching Band took second place in the parade competition. This band, which is 105 members strong (grades 7-12), is under the direction of Mrs. Shane Bonney and was led this year by Drum Major Madelyn Allen. The Concert Band (grades 7 and 8), under the direction of Mr. Bonney, competed in the Middle School Class (an open class, regardless of school size) against nine other middle school bands, and took third place.

Due to the outstanding finishes in all 7 categories of the competition, the West Canada Valley Band Program was awarded the coveted BEST OF CLASS trophy, signifying WCV Bands as 2024 Class B Champions. In the past seventeen years of attending the pageant (with a two year hiatus due to COVID in 2020 and 2021), the band program has been named Class Champions ten other times at the Sherburne Pageant of Bands (2007, 2008, 2010, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2019, 2022, 2023) – a feat that very few programs ever attain.

The weather was extremely pleasant this year at the pageant and the number of parents and community members that flocked to Sherburne to see the bands compete was commendable. West Canada Valley definitely had one of the biggest fan cheering sections out of all the competing bands. The bands truly appreciate the support of everyone who attended, and the praise upon their return. The directors are very proud of these accomplishments, as are the students who were involved. WCV is extremely pleased to announce that pride in the band program continues to reach new heights. Congratulations students, we're proud of you and the community should be as well!

The mechanics that maintain our bus fleet, they have obtained another year of success from New York State Department of Transportation for bus inspection. Each bus is inspected by a NY DOT inspector twice a year. Thank Shane Korniat and Eric Morse, our two mechanics, when you see them.

The bus drivers and monitors that are operating your children's bus are probably the most important ingredient of all to the "safe and sound" ride your children deserve. It is their personal judgment and skills that will ultimately assure your children ride the bus in a "safe and sound" manner every day. Thank them when you see them.

FROM THE NURSE'S OFFICE

End of the Year Medication Pickup: Please contact the Nurses' office to make arrangements to pick up any unused medication by the end of the school year. Any medications not picked up by June 25th , 2024 will be discarded.

Physical Examinations: New York State Law requires a physical examination for all students entering the school district for the first time and when entering Pre-K, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th grade. Physicals are acceptable that have been performed no longer than 12 months prior to September 4th, 2024.

Sports: Any student that plans to play a school sport must have an up to date physical on file with the health office. Please keep in mind that if a student's physical was valid for one sports season it may not be valid for the next sports season. Physicals will be offered at school over the summer. Keep an eye out for upcoming dates which will be posted on ParentSquare.

Immunizations: New York State mandates students entering the grades listed below are required to have the following vaccines. These vaccines are required to be completed prior to the start of school in September unless otherwise noted.

Entering Grade 6: Tdap vaccine. This vaccine is required at age 11. If your child does not turn 11 until after September 4th, 2024 you will need to provide a doctor's note with the appointment date that they are scheduled to receive this vaccine.

Entering Grade 7: Meningococcal (Meningitis) vaccine.

Entering Grade 12: 2nd dose of the Meningococcal (Meningitis) vaccine unless the 1st dose was given at age 16 or older. The 2nd dose of the vaccine is to be given at age 16. If your child does not turn 16 until after September 4th, 2024 you will need to provide a doctor's note with the appointment date that they are scheduled to receive this vaccine.

If for any reason you are unable to make an appointment with your child's primary care doctor Herkimer County Public Health offers immunization clinics. All clinics are by appointment only call 315-867-1176 to schedule an appointment. Clinic dates and times are listed below.

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
