

Financial Information

- Proposition 2 \$53.5M (No tax increase)
 - Includes building condition survey work
 - Includes all proposed additions
 - Includes all interior renovations
 - Includes replacement stadium turf, track resurfacing, and all the tennis court renovations
- Proposition 3 \$5.3M (No tax increase)
 - Includes all work related to the conversion of the boys baseball and the girls softball fields to artificial turf
 - o Adds lighting to baseball, softball, and tennis courts
 - Adds ADA restrooms to the sports complex adjacent to the ball fields
- Proposition 4 \$24.9M (1.2% tax increase 2025-2026)
 - Adds cooling to all district classrooms.
 - Actively pursuing NYSERDA grants to potentially offset local share



CAPITAL PROJECT Board Action Tonight to Transfer \$1,000,000 from the Unemployment Reserve to the 2023 Capital Reserve

In consultation with Dr.Timbs, the District Financial Advisor - the following items bulleted below need to happen to facilitate keeping the tax increase of the proposed capital project at 0% for both Propositions #2 and #3:

Proposition 2 - Capital Project - Base Project - Facilities Renovations and Upgrades - Districtwide Proposition 3 - Capital Project - Athletic Facilities (contingent on Proposition 2 passing) Proposition 4 - Capital Project - Cooling (contingent on Proposition 2 AND Proposition 3 passing)

The Board needs to authorize a transfer to the Capital Reserve for \$1,000,000 from the Unemployment Reserve - the motion below is on the agenda:

Resolved, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the transfer of \$1,000,000.00 from the Unemployment Reserve to the Capital Reserve.

- > The Board needs to levy the taxes at the levy limit of 2.52% increase, which will be \$10,841,206
- > The District needs to reduce the budget an additional \$312,000 we are currently working toward that goal
