

ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

- Student attendance is essential to support academic growth. While we
 recognize there are various reasons students may need to miss school,
 efforts to ensure students are in attendance as often as possible will
 help support success.
- If an absence occurs, please fill out this <u>Report an Absence</u> form or call the Guidance Office and leave a message as soon as possible.
- Please sign in and sign out anytime you are picking up or dropping off your child. This allows the Guidance Office to double check the safety of your child. Your child will be given a pass to class when you sign them in at the Guidance Office.

TARDY POLICY

5th grade students are given a period of time to learn the new routines of using lockers and transitioning between classes. Kinawa staff will be present and available in the beginning weeks to support students and offer help as needed.

Once routines have been established, however, students are expected to make their best effort to get to classes on time in order so that learning can take place. A student is deemed tardy not in the classroom when the bell rings. A record of tardiness is marked in PowerSchool.



Consequences for Tardies:

3rd Tardy - Parents receive an email from our Student Supervisor 5th Tardy - Student will serve a lunch detention

Tardies "reset" if student attends classes with no tardies for five consecutive days.

Various levels of organizational and time management support will also be provided based on students' individual needs.

Overview of Kinawa's Schedule

5th and 6th graders in both Traditional and Montessori programs follow this structure.



MONTESSORI SCIENCE-6TH GRADE LOOP THIS YEAR


Students explore science through guided and open-ended-inquiry opportunities providing meaningful experiences with scientific process and natural phenomena. Students investigate interconnections between themselves and universe.

- Students take PE for <u>6 weeks of two trimesters</u>.
- Gym shoes are necessary, however students wear regular clothes and do not shower.
- Participation is expected unless a communication from parents or doctors is shared.
- PE goals include participation, sportsmanship, motor development, social adjustment, fitness & developing lifetime sports skills with individual, small group and team activities.
- Students will also receive Reproductive Health lessons during PE classes.

EXPLORATORY CLASSES

- Exploratory classes include:
 - o Art
 - Drama/Public Speaking
 - Technology
- Students take each exploratory class for <u>6 weeks of one</u>
 <u>trimester</u>. (The other 6 weeks of a trimester will be PE or Outdoor Explorers)
- The purpose of these classes are to provide an experience that supports each child's holistic development.
- Students DO NOT receive a letter grade in Exploratory classes, however they will receive a citizenship grade/comment.

EXPLORATORY CLASS: ART


- All students will have Art class for 6 weeks of one trimester.
- My expectations are that students come with a good attitude and try their own personal best!
- My goals are for students to:
 - " Use a variety of mediums and processes for making art
 - Gain a love for creating and an appreciation for art
 - Express individual personality and style through art



- Students will learn about different art careers, as well as art history, as we highlight a handful of famous artists.
- My hope is to also offer additional Art opportunities for students. Look for more information to come!

EXPLORATORY CLASS: TECHNOLOGY

- All students will have Technology for 6 weeks of one trimester.
- Students will complete weekly projects that cover the following topics:
 - Design thinking / screencasting
 - Animations
 - Coding
 - 3D Design and printing
 - Breakout Boxes and BreakoutEdu
 - Google Sketchup (house design)
 - Website design (portfolios)



EXPLORATORY CLASS: DRAMA AND PUBLIC SPEAKING

- All students will have Drama and Public Speaking for 6 weeks of one trimester.
- Goals of Drama & Public Speaking include creating a safe space to speak and perform, building trust amongst group members, and learning the basics of good speaking skills.
- We will focus on the many P's of Public Speaking: poise, pitch, pace, pronunciation/enunciation, projection, preparation, and practice. We also learn the importance of being good listeners and giving appropriate feedback as audience members.
- Activities may include games, speeches, and short performances to fit student needs.

MUSIC OR ELECTIVE WHEEL - <u>INFO SHEET HERE</u>

- Music classes or Elective Wheel classes are taken every day for the entire year.
- Students take ONE music class <u>OR</u> participate in the rotation of three Elective Wheel classes.

 - 0 Choir
 - o Band
 - o Orchestra
- Elective Wheel (trimester rotation)
 - Music Appreciation
 - Network
 - Outdoor Explorers

FIT HOUR

- Opportunity to provide ALL students academic instruction that meets their individual learning needs
- FIT Hour meets every day
- Classes include:
 - Academic Extension
 - Reading Lab
 - Writing Lab
 - Math Lab
 - TASK (Executive Functions/Organizational Skills)
 - Resource or ELL
- These classes are fluid based on need throughout the year



BASE TIME

- Each student will be assigned to a Base Time teacher.
- Base Time occurs each Wednesdays of non-early release days and will meet at the start of the day prior to 1st hour.
- During Base Time, students will engage in various activities, some of which include:
 - Social Emotional Lessons
 - Relationship Building Activities
 - School-wide Initiatives
 - And more ...



TECHNOLOGY INTEGRATION - GOOGLE CLASSROOM

Students at Kinawa frequently use their personal device to access academic content, enhance instruction, and acquire assignment information through Google Classroom. <u>Each teacher will set-up a Google Classroom and will use</u> <u>it as a primary communication tool</u>. Students are encouraged to interact with each Google Classroom on a regular basis in order to support effective learning. Additionally, it is recommended that families regularly check each Google Classroom with their child as a way of maintaining meaningful home-school connections.

If questions regarding Google Classroom or specific assignments arise, please contact your child's teacher to obtain necessary clarification.

POWER SCHOOL AND GRADES

PowerSchool Parent Portal (Directions HERE):

Parents may access a student's grades and attendance at anytime by establishing a Parent Portal account through PowerSchool. Information for establishing an account is shared with incoming families in the fall through the guidance office. Please call (517) 706-4706 if you have questions. PowerSchool grades are not "real time" and will be considered up to date at 6 weeks intervals for mid-term progress reports. If a parent has questions about an assignment or missing work, they are encouraged to contact the teacher. <u>Parents can</u> <u>program PowerSchool to send automatic weekly grade updates to their email addresses</u>.

Report Cards/Grades:

Report cards are generated every twelve weeks, at the end of each trimester (November, March and June). Students receive letter grades in all subject areas, with the exception of exploratories and electives. The following grading scale applies:

- Loaner devices are available when absolutely necessary
- Inappropriate device use will result in a loss of technology privileges and/or additional consequences

CELL PHONE POLICY - <u>INFO SHEET HERE</u>



While we recognize that cell phones are brought to school for various reasons, Kinawa's cell phone policy has been established to ensure focus remains on academics and student learning while students are here at school.

- Students that bring a cell phone to school must have it <u>turned off and in</u> <u>lockers throughout the entire school day</u>, specifically from 8:45 to 3:30.
- Students have <u>access to the "emergency" phone in our guidance office</u> if contact with family needs to occur during the school day.
- Cell phones that are removed from lockers will be taken by Kinawa staff and held in the office for pick up at the end of the school day.
- Please note, these cell phone restrictions have been put in place to <u>eliminate</u> <u>unnecessary distractions</u> and <u>encourage student learning</u>.
