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NEW LEADERS



Dr. Erin Rathke ECCS Superintendent

The Eastern Carver County School Board has selected Dr. Erin Rathke as the next superintendent effective July 1, 2024.

Rathke is currently serving as interim superintendent for the district. Her selection concluded a rigorous search process that started with six semifinal candidates and narrowed to two finalists in April.

The ECCS School Board contracted with superintendent search firm, Ray & Associates, to assist with identifying and interviewing superintendent candidates. Ray & Associates consultants met with board members, school staff, parents, students, and community members individually and in focus groups to help create a desired superintendent profile.



Nate Manaen Assistant Superintendent

ECCS is excited to name Nate Manaen as the next assistant superintendent.

Manaen will start in July and succeed Dr. Erin Rathke, who was earlier named superintendent.

Currently Director of Student Services at Anoka-Hennepin School District, Manaen brings almost 20 years of transformative leadership experience to the role. Before joining the Anoka Hennepin School District, where he started as Principal of Mississippi Elementary, Nate served as Principal at Ravenswood Elementary, a Prek-8 school in Chicago Public Schools. Nate started his career in education teaching third grade.



Sam Blank Principal Carver Elementary

Sam Blank has been selected as the next principal of Carver Elementary School.

Blank will succeed Ryan Finke, who is leaving the role for a principalship at an international school abroad. Blank has over 13 years of diverse experience in education. He served as the administrative dean at Chaska Middle School West since 2022. Before his time at West, Blank served as dean, summer school coordinator, classroom teacher, and reading interventionist at the elementary level in the Wayzata School District.




David Brecht Director of Finance and Operations

David Brecht has been named Director of Finance and Operations.

Brecht started in ECCS in 2005, he has served in the assistant and principal roles at Chaska High School, and the district's student services administrator. Before ECCS, he held a variety of positions in the Hopkins School District.

SCHOOL FINANCE CHALLENGES

School districts across the state, including Eastern Carver County Schools, are facing significant budget challenges. It's important to understand that despite breathless news coverage this past legislative session of a financial windfall for school districts, the end result for ECCS and other districts across the state was a mixed bag. Yes, there were historic increases in school funding, for which we are very grateful. But with that increase in funding came a historic number of mandates, many of which are either funded for one or two years or not at all. As a result, much of that increased funding is already tied to programming and not available for other district needs.



School districts are not immune from the inflationary pressures felt by individual households. Significant increases to the cost of utilities, transportation, supplies, health insurance premiums, property and liability insurance and cost of living increases are having lasting impacts on school budgets.

80% of our expenses are staff salary and benefits and the pressures to provide competitive packages to our district employees also puts a strain on the budget.

We highly value our staff and believe they are the best in the state. We want to retain the incredible staff we have and recruit strong talent to the district.

All of these factors combined have led to an anticipated deficit for the 2024-25 school year that will have an estimated \$3.8 million dollar impact on the district's unassigned fund balance. Thanks to responsible management of resources aligned with our strategic priorities, we have an unassigned fund balance available to cover that difference. That is not a responsible long-term strategy however. During the upcoming school year, ECCS leaders will continue examining all elements of the budget to map out cost containment strategies aligned with our strategic plan. Our focus continues to be student-centered, with a goal of minimizing impacts to classrooms and the student experience to the largest extent possible. Throughout this process, there will be opportunities for engagement, and many more updates to come.


