Course(s) in lieu of lunch/study hall:

By waiving his/her lunch/study hall, the student and parents/guardians acknowledge that:

- a) The student will miss important presentations, college and financial aid representative visits, and information typically presented in study halls, and that it is the student's responsibility to obtain whatever information he/she misses.
- b) The behind the wheel component of driver's education could be significantly delayed as the student would have no study hall during which he/she could drive. Counselors cannot facilitate driver education as it is run by the Physical Education Department.
- c) Unless graduation status dictates otherwise, students who did not pass all six classes in the previous semester will not be approved to waive lunch/study hall
- d) If a student has an unsuccessful second semester, he/she could be placed into a lunch/study hall for the following school year to take six classes instead of seven.
- e) ESS or ELL students may not drop their lunch/resource periods by simply asking their counselors, they must obtain approval from the chairpersons of the appropriate department.
- f) If the seventh class a student selects does not run because of insufficient enrollment numbers, or if the seventh class cannot fit because of a conflict, the student will be placed into a lunch/study hall.
- g) The deadline to turn in this form with a parent's/guardian's signature is **March 1st**, or the following Monday if March 1st falls on a weekend. After this date, lunch/study hall waiver forms will not be accepted.
- h) Seniors who are seeking fee waivers for their college applications must fill out a lunch program application and be deemed eligible for free/reduced lunch, even if they do not have a lunch period in their schedules.
