### Career Exploration

#### Assessments

- including skills inventories and learning styles

Facilitated use of AKCIS and other resources

#### Exploration of career clusters

- research into areas of interest for students, qualifications, job pathways, etc.

#### Connect to community resources

- Help a college bound student navigate admissions and explore potential majors
- Guide a student to seek out trades they would enjoy, requirements for apprenticeship programs and accommodations offered for testing, etc.

### Work Readiness Training

#### Self Advocacy

- Identifying SMART Goals, disclosure, ADA, systems advocacy etc.

#### Job Seeking Skills:

- Job searching, applications, resumes, interview skills

### Work-Based Learning

Students who show drive and motivation to practice skills on the job may be eligible for a Work Experience through DVR, with individualized placements, job shadowing and sampling and job coaching.
