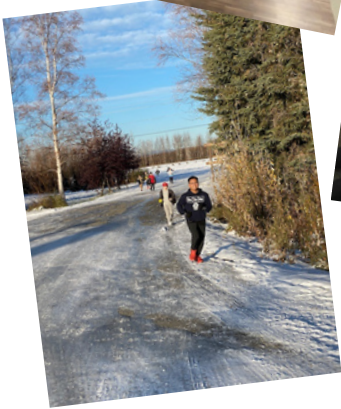

LEARNING

Our current data suggests that we have a lot more learning to do! This year, we are in the first year of implementing a cohesive, comprehensive reading curriculum K-5, including a walk-to-read intervention to specifically target reading skills and needs. We are also in the first year of a school-wide implementation of math curriculum materials. Our focus on data shines a light on our results and we are eager to see the Spring data set!

From Fall to Winter MAP scores we see:

- 47% of students met growth projections in Math.
- 32% of student met growth projections in Reading.
