Almost all students are placed in their first-choice school.

What are Pathways to High School Completion and Post-Secondary Opportunities?

There are many ways to earn a high school diploma and prepare for college and a career. The most common path is attending a traditional four-year public high school. But this option doesn't always work for every student. Some may want to embark on a post-secondary opportunity, some have fallen behind on credits or want to add job training or work experience with their education. In this guide, learn about the different pathways to graduation and beyond in Mapleton Public Schools.

How to Choose the Best Pathway for You

You have the right to enroll in public education until age 21 or you earn a diploma. Your educational goals are important! But with so many choices, it can be hard to know which will be the best fit for you and your life. For assistance, students, parents/guardians may contact:




Career and Technical Education Pathways

Frequently Asked Questions


Q: My student isn't interested in the CTE pathway offered at their school. Can my child attend the school without participating in the CTE program?

A: Yes. CTE pathways are additional choices for students within a school. The traditional option is still available. Please note, students cannot join a CTE program at another Mapleton high school. The only CTE program available to all Mapleton students, regardless of school enrollment, is Teaching for Tomorrow, the Teaching Pathway.

Q: My student chose to attend a school, but we have determined it isn't the right fit. Can my student transfer to a different Mapleton school?

A: Yes. Transferring is always an option; however, please keep in mind that each high school offers different classes at different times and may not be offering the courses on your child's current schedule. Please work with your current school director to identify the best school transfer plan.
