



# 2023-24 was a busy year full of engagement, excitement, and events. Here are just a few of our favorite moments captured during this academic year.

THROUGHOUT OUR SCHOOL archives lies an abundance of hidden-away memorabilia, ephemera from our collective past that makes it possible to curate displays highlighting our shared history for alumni, staff, faculty, and students. This year, we were able to connect the past with the present in many different ways. Upper School students worked on the Memory Lane Display featured at Homecoming which encouraged their classmates and teachers to comb through the memories that connected them with their school's histories. We pulled former CDS and ACDS teacher Bob Henson's paintings from various locations across campus to display together in the Joan and Tom Scott Gallery outside of the Alumni Gymnasium

during Homecoming week. This artistic display helped students identify a past teacher and his work, not only as an artist but as a much loved and deeply impactful member of our staff and community. In January 2024, Oreck Library was home to the ACDS Historical Display. Students were able to see that the halls they walk through, the courtyard they gather around, and the gym they play basketball in once belonged to our predecessor school. These spaces may have looked a little different, but the laughter heard and the lessons learned there sound and feel familiar. These connections to the past help our students formulate their own sense of belonging and give our teachers a sense of pride in carrying on the time-honored tradition of shaping learners in a hands-on, collaborative way.

The ACDS gymnasium, now known as the Alumni Gymnasium, showcases our predecessor school logos on a feature wall, and now our new Alumni Association logo is centered between them. This new logo was designed to represent all of our predecessors merged together to build a stronger school in Carolina Day. The pines of St. Genevieve-of-the-Pines, the cardinal of Gibbons Hall, the highlands and mountains we all

love, and the beautiful bell that CDS adopted from Asheville Country Day School all come together in this beautiful new rendition. This redesign also recognizes many of our special alumni, past staff, and coaches whose hard work and dedication have warranted honor and celebration over the years. Those that walk into the Alumni Gymnasium will now see these cherished individuals highlighted on the Alumni Association Award panels proudly displayed on either side of our logos.
