As the 2023-2024 School Year came to an end there were many causes for celebrations as well as excitement for the upcoming school year. Since our last *Your Schools* publication in February both the Winter

and Spring sports seasons brought in several notable accomplishments including multiple state placers in wrestling and track highlighted by an individual gymnastics state title on the balance beam by Hannah **Salgado**. We also collected our fourth Softball League title in the last four years. In the Arts, we were treated to the Spring Musical *Legally Blonde* under the direction of **Rob Albrecht** and the District Art Show which featured work ranging from our first graders up through our Advanced Placement artists at AHS. 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#### U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT BEST HIGH SCHOOLS 2024

This year, U.S. News & World Report magazine analyzed nearly 25,000 public high schools in all 50 states and the District of Columbia and then ranked nearly 17,600 of the highest-scoring public high schools in the nation on their performance on state assessments and how well they prepare students for college. Using these metrics Aurora High School (AHS) was ranked in the 97th percentile in the nation and in the State of Ohio.



Aurora High School (AHS) was ranked by the publication at #2 in the Akron Metro Area, #7 in Northeast Ohio, #20 in

the State of Ohio (out of 705 Ohio high schools) and at #569 in the country in their Best High Schools 2024 article.

The methodology used by U.S. News & World Report for this article focuses on six factors which include, College Readiness (30%), State Assessment Proficiency (20%), State Assessment Performance (20%), Underserved Student Performance (10%), College Curriculum Breadth (10%) and Graduation Rate (10%).

AHS Principal, Mike Hayes, said, "These rankings are nice for our community to see and are certainly reaffirming all the great work that goes on daily within The Greenhouse! However, like any quantitative metric, there is a qualitative story behind it that seldom gets told. In this case, that story exists in the wonderful relationships nurtured with students, the valuing of the process of learning, the ability to practice and develop empathy while becoming more resilient through collaborative efforts and critical thought. Thank you to all the Aurora staff and community members who work so hard to nurture learner roots allowing amazing human beings to blossom!"

#### **SUPERINTENDENT STATE OF THE SCHOOLS ADDRESS 2024**

Superintendent Mike Roberto was invited to speak on behalf of the Aurora City School



District (ACSD) at the Aurora State of the City luncheon on February 21, 2024. Roberto, who has just completed his 4th year as district superintendent, focused on the numerous recognitions the district has received. The ACSD

earned the highest Ohio Report Card rating of five stars in all five components of the Ohio Department of Education & Workforce state report card (Aurora is one of only six school districts out of over 600 in Ohio to earn this recognition both years the state has used the five-star designations). The state has also awarded BOTH Leighton and Miller Elementary Schools the Ohio PBIS Gold Recognition Award for their work during the 2022-2023 school year for designing a

supportive and systematic implementation of Positive Based Intervention and Supports (PBIS) throughout their respective buildings. Aurora High School (AHS) was also recognized by the State as a Purple Star School given to military-friendly schools that show a major commitment to students and families connected to our nation's military.

Along with those accolades, Roberto explained, "Leighton and Harmon Elementary Schools were recently listed in the U.S. News & World Report Best Elementary and Middle Schools respectively. Leighton was rated 205th out of 3,034 Ohio Elementary Schools (Top 7%) and Harmon was ranked 66th out of 2,446 Ohio Middle Schools (Top 3%). Leighton and Harmon Schools join Aurora High School which was once again recognized by the U.S. News & World Report as one of the best high schools in the United States. The U.S. News & World Report evaluated 1,011

high schools in Ohio and over 18,000 across the United States to develop their annual ranking. Aurora High School ranked as the number one school out of 52 high schools in the Akron Metro Area and within the top 1.7% (18th) of schools in Ohio as well as within the top 2.75% (495th) of all high schools across the country."

Roberto also provided an update on the potential new construction in the district. He explained, "Over the last two years, there has been overwhelming support to look into the possibility of new construction with the goal of replacing Craddock, which was built in 1911, with a new 9-12 high school and then moving the first and second grades in Craddock along with the preschool at Miller to Leighton which would also create more room for our kindergarten classes at Miller. Grades 3-5, currently at Leighton, would move to Harmon, and grades 6-8 at Harmon and the Board of Education offices would then occupy the old high school. This plan would provide much needed updated facilities and room to grow for literally the next generation of Greenmen. Over the next year, we will continue to work on our Master Planning process with a goal of having a series of staff and community meetings that will help our

architects from ThenDesign Architecture (TDA) to develop a solid overall plan for a new high school. The goal of the district is to have a Bond Issue for this project on the November 2024 ballot." Roberto said, "Although there is still a long way to go and much work to be done, we are excited for the journey. Over the next year we, along with TDA, will be holding meetings and will continue developing the Master Plan for this project." He added, "For the latest information on this project, visit our district website at www.aurora-schools. org and click on the link titled "ACSD Facilities Master Planning Project."

Roberto rounded out his speech by saying, "Thank you for your continued support and partnership as we all work to nurture the competencies within our strategic vision that will lead to young people in our schools becoming Aurora Learners who are Future Ready. Hopefully it is clear to you that we are deeply committed to protecting and promoting the strengths of Aurora; and undoubtedly one of them is the Aurora City Schools. I'm honored to lead this wonderful school system in such a great community and we appreciate the amazing support you give to our district. It is truly a fantastic time to be an Aurora Greenmen."

came in to work with our Environmental Science classes in order to discuss and complete activities focused on watersheds/ wetlands. Laura and her Environmental **Science** students also paired up with **Matt** Valencic (Audubon Society) in conjunction with the Citizen Science Project connected with Project H2Ohio/ODNR to exterminate buckthorn, which is an invasive species in this area. In March, the students braved the cold to help reduce the negative impact on our young forest areas here in Aurora. Also at AHS, Government teacher, Mike Rubin, teamed up with Physics Teacher, Dmitri Kourennyi, to provide some great insight to the young people in AP Comparative Government Class. Dmitri, who is originally from Ukraine and still has family there, spoke to students regarding his perspectives on the USSR and Russian culture! What a great way to take advantage of a primary resource.

If you have not seen or heard yet, the Leighton Adaptive Playground was "unofficially" opened the last week of school. We will have an "official" ribbon-cutting ceremony in September. A big thank you goes out to so many people, especially staff members Alisa Deininger (Leighton), Jen Simmerman (AHS), Kasie Stewart (AHS), and Michelle Nizen (Leighton) who all took the lead on the project. Thank you as well to all the **committee members** who contributed their time to reach this goal as well as to all of our donors from the community. Our architects from Then Design Architecture shared a similar presentation to the Aurora Board of Education at the Regular April Board Meeting except the latter presentation provided the projected costs for a new high school as well as for the reprogramming of our other four buildings. The Board then held two Special Board Meeting Work Sessions on April 30th and May 18th to further discuss the Master Facilities Plan. At the Regular Board Meeting on May 20, 2024, I presented an overview of this Master Facilities Plan, which included the potential costs, with the Board and for the public to hear as well. There is a recording of that presentation on our website under the May 2024 Board Meeting link. Toward the end of the meeting, the Board gave Treasurer Bill Volosin the green light to start the paperwork process to prepare a resolution for the Board to vote on which would start the process of putting a bond issue on the November 2024 ballot. That resolution will be discussed and voted on by the Aurora Board of Education during a Special Board Meeting on June 12, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. in the ACSD Conference Center. If approved there will be a final resolution to be voted on by the Board in July which, if approved, would put a bond issue on the November 2024 ballot.
