- **Search**
 - Type in what you are searching for. Remember sometimes you have to play around with the words you are using to get better results. Use the words **AND**, **OR**, or **NOT** to yield more or less results and to be more specific in what you are looking for.



- **Export**
 - Once you **read through an article** and decide the information is valuable to your project you need to 1) **save the article** and 2) **save the source information** into your Noodetools project

- **Saving article**

- Click detailed record in top left corner



- Under the tools menu on the right hand side click Google Drive

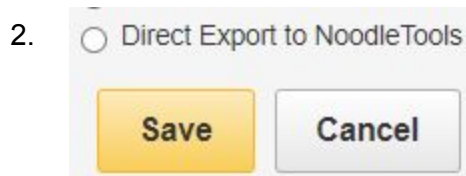


- Select your gmail account and **ALLOW** access
