At 4:06 PM, Dr. Hazel opened the meeting and greeted everyone.

APPROVAL OF JANUARY 25, 2024, MINUTES - DR. RACHEL HAZEL

- The minutes from the last meeting were approved by the committee.
- Motion: Approve the minutes
 - o Made by: Mr. M. Jayson Meyer
 - Seconded by: Ms. Mitch Aten
 - Motion passed with all **Ayes** (5-0).

2ND STEM BUS – DR. RACHEL HAZEL

- The transportation department created a STEM bus independently, which has had a significant impact.
- The current STEM bus is more suitable for elementary students and lacks features for middle and high school levels.
- A request is made for a second STEM bus specifically geared toward secondary schools.
- The original STEM bus was allocated \$150,000, with approximately \$97,000 spent and a remaining balance of about \$50,000.
- The proposed second bus requires \$120,000 due to additional costs, including implementing a lift, solar panels, and other features.
- The team has identified an existing bus for renovation, pending committee approval for materials and implementation.
- If approved, the second bus will be ready for the next school year.

Committee discussion pursed. Ms. Aten provided clarification on the committee's decision-making process. He emphasized that they are voting on whether the expense aligns with the referendum's intent rather than whether the money should be spent. The committee recalls past decisions regarding allocating funds for the science classroom renovations and expressed concerns about the lack of data on the specific needs of science classrooms and standard specifications. Mr. Seis joined the discussion and clarified that the funds for the STEM bus could come from the science classroom remodeling line, if the committee agrees to it. The following motion is made:

- Motion: To allocate funds for an additional STEM bus as it aligns with the spirit of the referendum.
 - Made by: Mr. M. Jayson Meyer
 - Seconded by: Ms. Mitch Aten
 - Motion passed with all Ayes (5-0).

Ms. Diane Smith requested to see details on what line item will be used for funding the STEM bus.

Mr. Jake Lammers expressed a concern about the role of the committee in evaluation of funds for the bus, emphasizing that their role is not to approve or disapprove funds but to ensure compliance with science classroom referendum guidelines.

COMMITTEE MEETING NORMS AND PROCEDURES – DR. RACHEL HAZEL

- Dr. Hazel initiated a comprehensive discussion on the operational procedures of the committee tasked with overseeing the expenditure of funds as mandated by a referendum. She underscored the critical importance of ensuring that taxpayer money is utilized precisely as outlined in the referendum's directives.
- She expressed concerns regarding the current frequency of committee meetings and the procedures employed in disseminating information. She highlighted the need for a more structured approach to information sharing and decision-making within the committee.
- To address these concerns, Dr. Hazel proposed a more deliberate process wherein ample time is allocated for the preparation and presentation of information before each meeting. This, she believes, will enable committee members to review the data thoroughly and formulate informed questions, leading to more productive discussions.
- A key point of contention is raised regarding the interpretation of Sunshine Laws and their applicability during committee meetings. While some members believe that the committee operates primarily as an information-gathering body and thus may not be subject to Sunshine Laws, others expressed reservations and call for further clarification on the matter.
- Recognizing the need for clarity and consensus on these issues, the committee agrees to revisit the discussion in future meetings. Plans are made to seek additional information and guidance to ensure compliance with relevant regulations while optimizing the efficiency and effectiveness of committee proceedings.
- The committee agreed on the following:
 - Quarterly committee meetings.
 - o Committee workshops in preparation of the Annual report in July and August.
 - o Annual Report submission on the second Board meeting in September.
 - Monthly Financial Reports.
 - Presentations to be sent two weeks in advance for committee review.
 - One week for committee members to respond with questions, which would give the district a whole week to prepare the answers.

PROJECT OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE MEMBER COMMENTS

Ms. Diane Smith:

- The committee received an email from a Read Pattillo parent. What is the protocol on responding to such emails?
- Dr. Hazel shared that the school board requested an update on various school sites, during which a slide mentioning "closure" was included, although closure was not the primary intention of the discussion. The focus was on assessing whether repair costs exceeded the value of the sites, particularly regarding Read Pattillo, situated on a small lot. Read Pattillo's attendance is affected by rezoning, with many students bussed from other areas due to demographic shifts. While acknowledging community input on Read Pattillo, Dr. Hazel suggested that its future may not fall under the purview of the half-cent sales tax committee, as potential rebuilding costs would likely be covered by capital projects funds.
- Dr. Hazel also shared that there will be a board workshop in April on the five-year plan in which updates on all of the schools will be given.
- An update on Read Pattillo will be provided at the next committee meeting.

Ms. Sandy Burke-Bishop:

• Orange City School: Is there any update on the old building at Orange City elementary school? Mr. Ron Young shared that the district was just told by the state that it is a contributing resource to the historical district of Orange City. The district will update the committee after discussion with the school district attorney.
