GREETINGS - Ms. DOLLY VIDERMAN

Ms. Viderman opened the meeting and introduced Ms. Patty Corr, Chief Operating Officer. The meeting was called to order by Ms. Corr at 4:02 PM.

APPROVAL OF JANUARY 25, 2024, MINUTES - Ms. PATTY CORR

FINANCIAL REPORTS - MS. MELISSA ALDERMAN

Ms. Alderman presented the following financial reports:

- Half-cent Sales Tax Revenues for the Prior and Current Year Through May 13, 2024, for Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2024.
 - Third Quarter Discretionary Amount: \$3,589,403.51
 - Reminder: The estimated revenue for the year was reduced by \$2M due to the trend being low with a new projected total of \$63,910,024.
- Half-cent Sales Tax Expenditures from Inception through March 31, 2024, for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2024
 - Total sales tax collected to date: \$364,142,060.
 - o Remaining estimated revenue to collect: \$115,857,940.

- Total expenditures through November: \$41,828,978.
- Remaining balance to be collected: \$141,016,875.
- Consolidated Monthly Financial Statement through March 31, 2024, for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2024
 - o Reviewed the consolidated sales tax related funds and other specific financial statements.

STEM BUS UPDATE:

Ms. Alderman provided clarification on the STEM 2 Bus that was discussed at the last meeting. Contrary to previous information, the budget for the STEM bus falls under the Technology category, not Science Classrooms. This is consistent with STEM 1 Bus. Dr. Kuhn expressed concern about the budget, but Ms. Alderman assured him that it would not affect his department budget. Ultimately, the STEM bus project was approved as a separate initiative within the Technology category.

Ms. Sandy Burke-Bishop:

- Ms. Bishop has requested an update on HVAC condition report.
- Concerns were raised regarding the construction projects under the school district's half-cent sales tax program.
- Ms. Bishop proposed that the annual report should include information about the increased costs of
 projects due to inflation. This, she believed, would help in preparing the community and stakeholders for
 any necessary adjustments in the project plans.
- She mentioned the need for clarity on the status of specific schools, accurately reporting this information and ensuring that any changes to the project plans were well-communicated.
