School

Totino-Grace has a curriculum that is both college preparatory and comprehensive. Founded in 1966 by the Christian Brothers and School Sisters of Notre Dame, Totino-Grace enrolls over 700 students who enter from more than 100 different public and private middle schools across the Twin Cities. Totino-Grace is accredited by Cognia. Totino-Grace partners with Founders Education/Educere to help support transfer students to meet graduation standards when necessary, as well as support students who need to participate in credit recovery.

Premier Academic Programs

Kathleen Murphy Scholars Program. This program meets the needs of our highest performing students to intellectually challenge them in a rigorous course of study, and satisfy their intellectual curiosity through cultural enrichment experiences outside the classroom. KM Scholars are required to take a rigorous course load including an increasing number of Honors or AP courses each year; attend at least 4 cultural enrichment seminars annually outside of the school day; complete a research-based capstone project focused on a topic of interest to the student. The KM Scholars work with an academic mentor on the project and present their findings to the school community.

E3 Engineering Institute. E3 is a 3-year Engineering program, similar to Project Lead the Way. Through a hands-on, rigorous curriculum that includes coursework focused on engineering, as well as exposure to the field of engineering through program components occurring outside of the classroom, E3 Scholars are intellectually engaged and challenged above and beyond courses required for graduation. All E3 Scholars must take four years of science and math and 3 years of Engineering courses that culminate in a capstone Engineering project. E3 Scholars are encouraged to take additional courses in CAD, Woods & Metals, and Computer Science. Each E3 Scholar works with an Engineer mentor, specially trained to introduce students to the various fields of engineering and to engage students in the work they do at their Engineering firms.

Minnesota Bilingual Seals and World Language Proficiency Certificates. High school students who demonstrate specific proficiency in languages other than English may earn college credit and will have a competitive edge in our increasingly global society.

Class Rank

Totino-Grace does not rank students; we believe a class rank alone does not reflect the strength, ability and readiness of our college bound students. Academic Program

With approximately 93% of Totino-Grace students matriculating to college, we offer a strong college preparatory curriculum with extensive Honors, College in the Schools (University of MN) and Advanced Placement course offerings. This school welcomes students of all ability levels and offers additional structured support to students with identified needs through our Learning Support Pathways Program.

Totino-Grace is on a semester system. One credit is given per class per semester. Credits required for graduation:
