A Review of Music Over the Century

The ever-changing subject of music has growing evolving since the budding developments of society dating back almost 35,000 years. The following article will be comparing the music of the last century, a mere 100 years on the scale of evolution various melodies have faced:

The **'20s**: The Roaring 20's showed many advances in the way we hear music. With the invention of the electric record player, the market for music was booming. U.S. Musicians were thriving, and the industry was a steady place until music began playing on the broadcasts daily commercial radio. Consequently, the ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers) was born to calm angry musicians feeling as though they were losing profits from radio tunes. The organization made sure that artists were paid when their songs went on the radio, allowing popular genres of Jazz,

unlike Unfortunately, today, many genres of music featuring such unique cultures created issues of segregation, with only designated clubs allowing people to listen to their music in



Blues, Broadway, and Dance to continue to flourish without concerns regarding financial compensation. Jazz, in particular, was popular and earned the '20s the title of the "Jazz Age" due to the popularity of the genre and its spread from African American communities of New Orleans to clubs and dance halls alike.

The '30s and '40s: The 30's music scene was quite interesting as it was shaped by two contrasting topics: the Great Depression and Hollywood influences derived from the '20s. The Jazz scene split into two main genres of swing and big band, and Broadway music began to grow as more adaptations

of musicals were created. The first celebrity heartthrobs started here with "Crooners" such as Rudy Vallee. These pursued radio shows and films in addition to their career. Due to the grim nature of the Great Depression, Broadway and it's films' popularity soared as a distraction from the harsh atmosphere of the time. In general, the '30s and '40s relied on music to get them through the difficult times of poverty and depression.

The '50s: During the '50s, the American dream had grown much stronger. Following the depression, most Americans went back to their prior ideations as a source of comfort, with music being the exception and facing drastic changes. Music began reflecting on the recognition of the Civil



Recently, our school has implemented the "Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate" (ALICE) system for safety in the event of a school intruder or lockdown-type situation. For those of you not aware,

Annasti Turissini expresses: "I think it is the stupidest thing.

Why should we be endangering ourselves to fight against someone?

We could get hurt much worse if we try and attack the predator. I think that it's better to just hide and let the police handle the situation."

Arabella Heinzelman believes:

"I think we should be defending ourselves in this type of situation. We might be able to save more lives by taking down the shooter. It is a little risky, but I personally think it is worth it." It is quite apparent that our school has some differing opin-

ions regarding how we should ap-

proach a situation involving a harmful intruder. Despite this, "Thank You" to the people who took their time to share their input regarding this change. It is important to note that while it is a much different protocol than what we are used to, ALICE has been proven to be significantly more effective as this method allows for teachers, students, and staff members to do what is appropriate for the unique situation at hand. Certain people may not believe the defense tactics are the best response to someone potentially armed with weapons, while others recognize that, statistically speaking, A.L.I.C.E. is proven to save a significantly higher number of lives compared to the traditional lockdown drill. It is important that students, teachers, and staff to practice the protocol often as the best way to be safe is to be prepared.

22 Kill Challenge

This year, 8th-grade history teacher Mr. Herzog and twenty-two, 8thgrade students participated in the 22 kill pushup challenge. In 2012, the Veterans Administration released a Suicide Data Report that found an average of 22 veterans die by suicide every day. The 22KILL initiative started in 2013, at first just as a social media movement to raise awareness and later it became an official 501 3 nonprofit organization in July of 2015. In 2016, as the push-up initia-

tive swept social media, 22KILL began its transformation from awareness to a suicide prevention program. By the end of that year, the viral campaign and the fundraising that accompanied it, allowed us to donate over half a

million dollars to sponsor other veteran service organizations. In 2017, 22KILL began to acquire and develop traditional and nontraditional mental wellness programs. It now offers a myriad of services through Stay The Course, Tribal Council, Forge, Wind Therapy, WATCH, and White Star Families.

With this, Mr. Herzog set out to contact an organization to donate the money earned from students doing the push-ups and from donations from teachers and other students. He contacted The Nam Knights and in-

formed them about him wanting to earn money for the veterans. The Nam Knights told him that they would contact him after they consult- PTSD after years of service. ed with the entire club. They called







Mr. Herzog and told him that they wanted to decline his offer. Mr. Herzog was taken aback and confused at first, but then the Nam Knights told him that whatever the school earns that they would double it. Mr. Herzog then contacted Tails of Valor, which is an organization that trains dogs to help veterans cope with

> This year's total was about \$3,800 with the combined total of the Nam Knights and a donation from the 8th-grade students. The high school Patriot club also donated some money as well to contribute to the cause. At the assembly, the members of

the Sons of Liberty said some facts about some of the drastic wars and events tied to these wars. Then the Nam Knights said a few things about their organization and what they do. After all the speeches, Mr. Herzog called down every student that participated in the push-up challenge to come down and complete their last 22 push-ups for the challenge. Some of the Nam Knights members also took part in the push-ups as well.

> Once everyone completed their push-ups, Mr. Herzog gave the Tails of Valor the large check.

There were also a few news stations there to interview a few of the students in the Sons of Liberty club and Mr. Herzog. And all the students were able to pet and play with the puppy that was brought by the Tails of Valor organization. The Sons of Liberty club and Mr. Herzog thank every student and faculty member for donated money to

the cause!

movement: Rhythm and Blues (R&B), as well as Rock and Roll, popularized many African American artists, causing conflicts between people either believing that the white population capitalized on the African American struggle or that the music began to form a unity between both races. One thing is certain though: the '50s shaped the modern world's music forever, with Rock and roll emerging as one of the top genres of the decade with its symbolism of teenage rebellion and style. Although Elvis is an artist known as "The King of Rock," the highlights of the genre did not start with him. Some of the first rock stars were Little Richard, The Coasters, and Fats Domino... Also, Pop music dominated the world during this time. Artists like Frank Sinatra (Who is still popular in modern times), Doris Day, and Ella Fitzgerald took the world by storm with their hits.

The '60s: This is the decade known as the "British Invasion." England's music culture had artists such as The Rolling Stones, The Beatles, The Who, and The Kinks finding their suc-

cess in our country during this time, with Songs such as "Picturebook" by The Kinks and "Yesterday" by the Beatles captivating audiences and gaining fame from their unique styles. The Beatles particularly stood out for causing a craze across the nation: Beetlemania. Since their appearance on the Ed Sullivan show, the Beatles were suddenly loved by almost all, with merchandise of shirts, lunchboxes, bouncy balls, etc. being produced. Despite their departure in 1970, loyal fans still praise their music.... Also, R&B was still popular, with artists such as Aretha Franklin, Diana Ross, The Supremes, and Stevie Wonder keeping the Civil Rights Movement alive with the sound of their music.

The '70s: The '70s were the golden days of vinyl records and Rock 'N Roll. Zeppelin, Led Pink Floyd, and David Bowie became rock legends and are still honored today with merchandise and nostalgic playlists. In addition, Queen, The Ramones, KISS, and Misfits The became icons of Rock 'N Roll.

Also, Disco and Hip-Hop entered the music scene. The ability to produce more than six tracks on records led to furthering the development of music, with Disco becoming the iconic music genre of the '70s. Previous Artists, such as Rod Stewart and Diana Ross, began to create pieces of this genre due to the popularity. However, Disco soon lost it's popularity after teens



realized it promoted commercialization, a concept they had previously rebelled against.

The '80s: "Bruce Springsteen, Madonna, Way before Nirvana there was U2 and Blondie and other music still on MTV..." Bowling

For Soup, a band from the time, said the '80s music scene consisted mostly of pure image as MTV became a favorite network for popular artists. (Yes, believe it or not, there was music on MTV before it became the same 10 Jersey Shore reboots being played at 3 A.M every night...) New genres such as new wave, hip hop, and hair metal began to change the music scene to the

> point that the genres are still influential today. Michael Jackson, Prince, Whitney Houston, Tiffany, Madonna, Cher, and New Kids on the Block all became the pop legends of the '80s. Hair metal stars included Metallica, Ozzy Osbourne, Iron maiden, Aerosmith, and Motley Crue. MTV showcased these stars and became the first Television Station to

showcase music videos exclusively, adding theatrics, fashion, and drama to the mix of factors in music, thus influencing songs today. Stars like Madonna, Michael Jackson, and Whitney Houston embraced trends through their music vid-

embraced trends through their music videos. Their songs set the

bar for pop music and stay relevant despite the constant change in popular media. CDs, Cassettes, Walkman players, and Boom Boxes also allowed people to listen to music on the go when they were away from the musical comforts of their TV.

The '90s: Filled with one-hit wonders, rap, pop, and alternative music, the '90s musical tastes varied dras-

sical tastes varied drastically. Genres like Techno and hip-hop had a sudden resurgence that lives on through the decade with artists like MC Hammer, Vanilla Ice, and Tone Loc. However, in 1992 a unique type of rock music's increased popularity changed everything. Nirvana released "Smells Like Teen Spirit," which popularized alternative rock and changed the music industry and, although a bit dramatic, the lives of teens forever. Bands such as Pearl Jam and Soundgarden began to write songs with catchy lyrics about teenage angst and rebellion. However, in 1995, listeners moved on from this genre for a bit in search of new styles. Then, Bubblegum

pop emerged with Britney

Aguilera. Also, The later years had a sudden uprising in popularity of tradi-



tional boy bands from the '80s. This decade went full circle, and, to that, I believe everyone was saying "Oh well, whatever, never mind".

The 2000s and the **'10s:** The more recent years brought in diverse styles of music such as Hip-hop, ushered into style by Usher, Justin Timberlake, and several more. Kanye West, Jay-Z, and Eminem refurbished these styles with their own twists. Although they are not necessarily traditional hip-hop, they are all compiled of rap and other similar styles. However, every decade has its darker side and in this case, it is emo music. The genre gained its name from the emotional lyrics and overall dismal tones of the

music. Bands such as My Chemical Romance, Green Day, and Panic! At the Disco sported "Guyliner" and made ades, specifically computer-generated sounds, result in some artists creating songs that lack creativity, such as the songs

"Gucci Gang" by Lil Pump and "Versace" by Migos. Luckily, though, many great artists of this time make up for the lack of inspiration in the music of certain artists.


We bet all of you have heard of someone having Disney Plus, or you may have it yourself! Disney+ is an American subscription video on-demand streaming service

The plot of Frozen 2 is centered around Elsa being drawn into an enchanted forest because of demonic vodeling sounds she heard from the distance. Why this is the case, I don't know, but it seems like a convenient plot device on Disney's part. The driving motivation of the two main protagonists hinges off of learning more about their past and their deceased parents. Before this, how-

ever, the prologue involves a young King of Norway in shock after an unexpected attack on his Kingdom initiated by the restless spirits of the enchanted forest. Once

again, I feel that this is another lazy attempt to drive the main characters into conflict. This attack is mentioned again later on in the movie, but there is still no proper explanation given as to why they attacked during the timeline of the movie. Following the events of the attack on Norway, a recreation of the carriage scene from Shrek 2 takes place with Olaf taking Donkey's place. Maybe it's just me, but I feel that this was a little too "on the nose," or unimaginative, for the plot on be-

half of Disney. After a long journey, the protagonists Anna, Elsa, Kristoff, and Olaf reach the enchanted forest. However, the forest is protected by a magical barrier of unknown origin that impedes Elsa's path. For the sake of the plot, Elsa parts the barrier and allows another hour's worth of content to be poured into this drab film. After Olaf describes his midlife crisis in song



form, the four main characters reunite and have a pointless conversation that does not impact the outcome of the story at all whatsoever. Regardless of this, the protagonists meet a group of people that are native to the forest and make two whole appearances in the film, all the while displaying little to no character development. At this point in the movie, the story branches into three main parts. The main plot is focused on Elsa trying to find herself and discover her origin and identity, while Anna and Olaf are trying to recover after leaving Elsa, topped off with a half-baked side plot of Kristoff trying to propose to Anna. Elsa is the highlight/main focus of the people, and, in her storyline, she disregards the moral of the first film and abandons her sister while venturing out to do some soul searching. This is the point in the story where Anna and Olaf are sent away by Elsa and

attempt to convey the feeling of heartbreak for the second time in the series. Keep in mind that, through all this, there is not much to say about Kris-

toff. If the storyboard artists wanted to do something with this character they should've at least given him a better character "arc" and not just a black and white personality. The last portion of the movie was pretty eventful, so here is a quick summation of the plot: Elsa finds the answers to her past and how she can resolve the problem- The reason the forest is mad at Norway is because the King of Elsa's kingdom killed the leader of the Forest Tribe in an attempt to keep a

certain dam standing. The reason is unexplained why, but the dam is stopping the forest from surviving peacefully. After Elsa sees this, she is turned into an ice sculpture, Olaf gets "Thanos Snapped", and Anna sees a vision of what her sister saw. (Once again, merely a convenient plot device.) After knowing the plight of the dam to the forest, Anna lures some rock monsters to the dam to destroy it. And, because it's a Disney movie, Elsa comes back to life, Olaf is reborn, and everybody lives happily ever after. Eventually, it is shown that Elsa is a living incarnate of a spirit of the forest. So, after the main conflict is resolved, Elsa abandons her kingdom (Like the responsible woman she is) and lives in the forest with her people. Other loose ends are also tied up, with Kristoff finally proposing to Anna (divorce is inevitable). All in all, it was a fairly rushed movie... The plot was half-baked and none of the individual characters had any personality or "time to shine" on their own. My final verdict: If you have a four-vear-old cousin with little to no attention span or concepts of decent movie plots, Frozen 2 is the movie for you!




