Preparing for a possible zombie apocalypse

There have been many rumors about the impending zombie apocalypse and there have been supposed zombie attacks in history. This all makes you wonder what if it happens? You may have many questions like..

How a zombie is created? Or how do you kill a zombie? Or what is a zombie? Hopefully I will be able to give you all these answers and more. I will cover the creation of a zombie, the anatomy, the best weapons and, much more. Here is your average zombie.

A zombie is basically a human who is infected with a virus. We are not sure what the virus is but some believe it is solanum.

Solanum is 100 percent commutable and 100 percent fatal. It is not waterborne or airborne, and dies quickly in an open environment. Infection can occur only through direct contact with bodily fluids. A zombie bite is by far the most recognizable means of transference, but it is not the only way.
