After practicing once and sometimes twice a week, the ACE Team quickly leaped into the competition as prepared as we possibly could be.


We started off against Panther Valley, which was almost a

'Cool' is not on the list of ingredients

Cigarettes contain much more than just nicotine and possible cancer

As a bunch of people come up to you with a cigarette asking you to join them, think twice before you give your answer. Do you really know what is in it? Do you know what you will be letting into your body if you give in? Do you know what it can do to your body? Do you know the facts?

There are more than 4,000 chemicals in tobacco smoke. At least 68 of those are known to cause cancer. Let's think for a moment. Who wants to have cancer? I certainly don't.

Well, if you smoke, you are letting dangerous and cancerous chemicals into your body.

Let's look at some commonly known items that are in cigarettes.

There is paint, rocket fuel, carbon monoxide (weren't we taught that was toxic?), arsenic (a poison), methane (sewage gas), vinegar, lighter fluid, batteries, candle wax, barbecue lighter, insecticides, and toilet cleaner. Personally, I would not want these in my body. And I would think you wouldn't either.

According to the CDC, smoking affects every organ in the body. One in every five deaths is due to smoking. That is equal to 20% of the United States' deaths. They also said that more deaths are caused each year by tobaccouse than by all deaths from human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), illegal drug use, alcohol



use, motor vehicle injuries, suicides and murders combined.

Smoking also improves our chances of getting cancer by around 20 times! It also leads to coronary heart disease, strokes, and lung and heart diseases, which eventually lead to death.

So obviously, we know smoking kills. Besides killing, it leads to other gross appearances. Smokers usually have yellow teeth, bad breath and they smell of smoke, too.

If I were you, I would not want any of those features. So why even take a chance with one cigarette? You may say, "Oh, one won't do any harm!" Yes, it will. With one cigarette, you can get addicted and want more and more.

The chemical in cigarettes that is addicting is called nicotine. It gives us a feeling of alertness and calmness. The issue is that it isn't stored in the body. It only is for a few minutes so our body just wants more and more.

If we take nicotine long enough, our brains will lower our natural mood.

Therefore, we will need to smoke just to stay in our normal state.

Some people can't even go a few hours without smoking and refrain from getting depressed. So, just that one cigarette can make all the difference in the world.
