At the evening's end, the



There were some fun group dances like the Cha Cha Slide, the Cupid Shuffle and the Electric Slide.


There was a lot of delicious snacks that the Student Council members brought, like brownies, cookies, chips and fruit.

Do you like going to the movies with your family? Well, this summer is the best time to go. Here are the top 5 movies to see.




