Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit - Mrs. Husack reported we did have our meeting in July at our board room down at the IU. I wanted to report back out in regards to the golf tournament that we had in June. They are anticipating about \$9,500 in profits from that. We did have a record number of 90 golfers. So thank you to those that had come out who supported the IU and the Special Needs Children's Foundation. Put it on your calendars, I'm going to see you, Tuesday, June 18, 2024 is our next golf tournament. I also wanted to thank Dr. Eib, her last day at the IU after 14 years was on Friday, August 11th. She took the IU to a really great place and I really thank her for all of her time, her effort, her support to our district, and to our students and our staff. So, I wish her well in her retirement. Her last day again was August 11th. Today, we had Dr. Greg Koons start as the new executive director at the IU. So, we welcome Dr. Koons and wish him all the success in creating his step in the IU. He started today and lucky for him tomorrow is our opening day for our teachers and staff. Our opening day for the IU is

tomorrow at Parkland High School, so I want to thank Parkland for allowing the IU to have their opening day at their facilities. Thank you, Mr. Green.

<u>Lehigh Career & Technical Institute</u> - Mr. Fedorcha commented unlike the IU, we did not have a July meeting although I kept trying to tell everyone we did and nobody would listen to me, so we did not have one. That's it.

Legislative Report - Mr. Green commented Mrs. Snyder is not here.

<u>Lehigh Carbon Community College</u> - Mr. Green commented we had a meeting also the same old, same old. No, I am only kidding. We did this evening have some people from the college here with us. Are you going to talk about that?

Dr. Link commented please do.

Mr. Green commented okay, they talked about the SHINE program and if all of the people have even half of the enthusiasm that I saw from those people tonight, it's gotta be a wonderful program. I mean they were so excited and ecstatic just to be part of it. Talking to other people whose children have been there, it sounds like a really good program. I think Northern Lehigh is very fortunate that LCCC has chosen us to be one of the people they work with. And, you certainly can add anything to that if you'd like.

Dr. Link commented sure. There was just a SHINE open house at our SHINE classroom upstairs in Slatington Elementary School that served about 30 children during the summer camp and served about 50 children during the school year for 36 weeks after school four days a week. They are receiving homework support, they are receiving support with socially emotional regulation. They are receiving a free dinner every night as part of the program, and then a heavy emphasis on STEAM activities leaning to STEAM-related career pathways. We are the only district in Lehigh County that is able to offer such a program after-school and we're very proud of that and very grateful for the partnership with Lehigh Carbon Community College.

Mr. Green commented thank you.

Dr. Link commented sure.

Solicitor's Report - Attorney Roddick commented yes, just very briefly I wanted to remind the board that beginning this school year, that 2023-2024 school year, the Homeschool students are able to participate in co-curricular activities and academic courses at the district for up to at least one quarter of the school day that full-time regular students could attend provided that they meet the eligibility criteria for the course, any of the prerequisite criteria for the course and as long as they comply with all policy rules and regulations. That's also extended to prevent homeschool students to participate in career and technical education through the district. Parents are responsible for providing any tuition for any students who dually enroll in a home education program in the district unless there is space available on the bus and it's at the regular time, the district could require any homeschool student to take consecutive classes so that there isn't necessarily downtime in between those course because the children would be in supervision, etc. They would count in the daily membership of the district for purposes of some reimbursement and of PIMS reporting. So, I don't know if anybody has any questions about that. It's brand new starting this school year. No, okay. That concludes my report, thank you.

SPECIAL BOARD REPORTS (cont.) Assistant Superintendent's Report - Dr. Stoker commented thank you. In front of you at your places and out there for the public we have the ESSER grant spending update. This includes all of our spending through July 31st, as we did not have a July board meeting. I'm happy to report that ESSER 2 has been expended. So, ESSER 1 and ESSER 2 are now done. ESSER 2 was finalized for salary and benefits for technology integration specialist, our ELDP teacher, Kindergarten teacher, Director of Technology, Curriculum and Instruction and paraprofessionals. Our ESSER 3 was used for much of the things that we did over the Summer for Department Leader stipend and benefits, Summer Horizons and INSPIRE classroom supplies, high school and middle school STEAM camp supplies, ESY, Open Horizons, INSPIRE and summer learning program teachers and paras, nurse salaries and benefits, bussing to and from the summer programs, salary and benefits for the Director of Educational Technology and Curriculum Instruction, technology integration specialists, Kindergarten teacher, nursing services at Peters, food service salaries and benefits for the summer program. So, much of what we did over the summer was covered through ESSER 3. ESSER 3B for learning loss we also used for our social worker for social and emotional learning professional development that we did with our middle school and high school related to the goat therapy that we had for students with spring keystone testing and also for our staff. Then we also used that for the lightspeed classroom which is a platform that we use with our technology that we have as classroom management through technology, Also, summer enrichment, we had salaries and benefits of our middle school and high school STEAM camp. Then we had some after school tutoring that carried over for the after-school part of that grant. So, we still have until September of 2024 for the ESSER 3 grant, so that's the only one we still have remaining. Any questions on that? Alright, thank you very much.

<u>Business Manager's Report</u> - Mrs. Molitoris commented thank you. We do finally have a state budget and our state numbers came in. I'd just like to share with the board of education. We had flat funded our basic and in our special ed based on last years numbers, we did receive an additional \$278,000 in basic ed funding. An additional \$73,000 in special ed funding for an overall increase of \$351,000 that was not revenue in our original budget, but we will now be receiving additional revenue from the state based on the basic ed and special ed.

Mr. Green commented good, so now we don't have to raise taxes next year. We'll see about that. Thank you, Mrs. Molitoris.

<u>Superintendent's Report</u> - Mr. Link commented thank you, Mr. Green. My report will be very brief this evening. We're at the six month point that we have to publicly consider revising our health and safety plan which was put in place during the COVID pandemic. Our health and safety plan is available on the homepage of our district website. I am recommending that we make no changes to the health and safety plan. We stayed status quo with how we ended last school year which is truly minimal interventions or restrictions throughout our buildings. I'm open if any school board members want to consider changing the plan, but again, administratively, recommendation is that we keep the plan status quo. We will continue to review it every six months through September of 2024. Okay, hearing none, we will leave it as is. I will have it posted again or update it on the website with the review date of this evening. That will be up on the website tomorrow.

Mr. Green commented does the board have to vote on that?

Mr. Christman commented so after September 2023, does that mean we don't have to do it every six months anymore or is it that?

Mr. Green commented but do we have to vote on it to approve it?

Dr. Link commented no, we just have to open it up publicly to see if there's anybody who wants to. Okay. Next, I have the great pleasure of presenting two of our school board members thing evening with years of recognition from the Pennsylvania School Board Association. You know our school board members give a lot of their time to our district in support of our students, our faculty, and really the whole community ensuring that our students have resources and opportunities. Of course, I'm sure you're all aware that they do that as a volunteer. They are not receiving any compensation for the hours, and thought, and often time stress that they put into operating a school district here and

I know that we are all very grateful for that. This evening, I get to recognize first Mrs. Gale Husack for eight years of continuous service to the Northern Lehigh School District. Congratulations and thank you for everything you do.

Mrs. Husack commented thank you very much.

Dr. Link commented absolutely. And I also get to recognize this evening, Mr. Robin Distler, one of our school board members. Robin has been a school board member consecutively now for 12 years. Thank you for everything you do, Sir.
