# SPECIAL BOARD REPORTS

Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit - Mrs. Husack commented sounds good. We did have our meeting in March. Our next meeting is scheduled for April 15th, we're doing a spring fling meeting prior to our board, but it will be again at the IU facility. Meeting is starting at 6:30 p.m., feel free to join us. Some highlights from our March meeting, there was another presentation on February 22nd. There's some information on the website and some of our social media links where we presented a Lehigh County student with an adaptive bike. Fantastic things, these students come where they have the potential, maybe never being able to go with their family riding a bike on the DNL or on the boardwalk anywhere. There's th fund through the special children's foundation that we present these children with these types of bikes. They're adaptive they have parental controls at time and just the smile on these individual's faces is just phenomenal to watch. So, I thank those who contribute to the special needs children's foundation and a couple of things going through the year. Comin up, June 18th we have our annual golf tournament out Old Homestead. Dr. Stoker and I, so far that I know, will be attending but looking forward if anybody is wanting to go. There is information on the website, I do have a brochure, please feel free. That money does help items like the special needs children's foundation and those adaptive bikes. Some of the other updates - there is the 2024/2025 facilities plan which we'll be voting on coming

up. That is the facilities that the IU has approved for additional classrooms both in Lehigh County which has an MDS program coming and then an Allentown learning and achievement school with the Lehigh County advanced autism program update. So, that's all in the program coming up for vote tonight. The other is our comprehensive plan that is out on our website. That is the 2024-2027 comprehensive plan. It focuses on two goals: improve professional staff retention and by 2027 the IU to develop an evolved professional learning plan for the PDE requirements. So, some of those items are out on the website. Feel free to take a look at those. The last is a project update that they're working on. Dr. Scott out at the IU is working through this but it's called Project Aware which is advancing wellness and resilience and education. It's a great program, collaborative project going on. I'm looking forward and hoping that our district becomes involved in that. There's some more information coming out in the 24-25 school year to have access for mental health services for our students. So, I look forward to sharing that information when more is available. Thank you, Mr. Green.

Lehigh Career & Technical Institute - Mr. Fedorcha commented okay, the budget was approved by all nine school districts and this was the first time in I do not know when that there were no negative votes from any of the districts. So, that's kudos to LCTI and their staff who put their budget together well. The other thing is, our numbers are coming in for next year. The fifth grade tours have really escalated things to making it look much better as far as number, with the idea also that there are 3 programs right now that are over-enrolled which is good and bad. The good part is the enrollment is there, the bad part is those students are now going to have to be looking at an alternative program which may be a negative on that part. But, we're working on that and we're working on a lot of things as far as making sure that all of our students will get what they want to get at LCTI. The other things is, on the website is the vision and our five-year plan and everything else. So, if you've never gone on LCTI to see really what's happening at LCTI besides the education part, please look at the website because it's really impressive what they're doing there and what we're doing with that. One other things too, and I don't know if the student was going to announce this but I will and I'm going to apologize I do not know her first name, I should have written it down. Miss Jachowicz is a student here as well as LCTI. There was a competition in which the students designed a pin that they will be using when they go to the national conventions because, like if you've been to a national convention everybody shares pins. That's a big thing, everybody goes out. So, there was a competition done and it was done through Mac Motors. Mac Motors funded that and is also funding the pins for the students. The pen will have a bulldog on it as well as recognizing LCTI. I'm going to try and get a number of pins for our board and I'm sure the student will get one herself. I just wanted to acknowledge that we really have a talented young lady both here and at LCTI. That's all I have, Mr. President.

Dr. Link commented I just want to look at Mr. Strohl and Dr. Bali, is that student Julia Jachowicz. Yeah, so that student's name is Julia Jachowicz, so thank you for sharing that Mr. Fedorcha.

Mr. Fedorcha commented I apologize for not remembering.

Lehigh Carbon Community College - Mr. Green commented we continue to be down in headcount and in number of credits being taken at LCCC. Fortunately, with the revenue that we're reaping from Amazon and the programs they have there. I don't know if you know that, but we're one of five colleges in the whole United States who specially trains Amazon people and it's quite the lucrative contract. Plus the extra money we're getting on some of CDs and things like that, our budget is coming out okay. Speaking of our budget, our budget was also approved unanimously by all the districts. I can tell you this, our budget now, school districts paid between 10 and 11 percent of the total. When I took a seat on the board which was back when pterodactyls were still around, we were paying like 33% of it. And I think if we were still in a situation where we had to pay three times as much to LCCC there would be a lot of pushback from a lot of people on a lot of things there. I think that's moving in the right direction. The third thing, Dr. Link and I went to a conference, last week or the week before, and there were some state legislators there. We talked a little bit about combining PASHI and LCCC into a new, improved system. The impression I got was like you know don't hold your breath, it ain't happening any time soon. While

SPECIAL BOARD REPORTS (cont.) the governor is pushing this pretty hard, it doesn't seem like the legislators are. I also had a brief conversation with Senator Argall, who's the chief of the senate education committee, and he's raising the same questions. I'm not sure what's going to happen there. Hopefully it won't get too carried away, but we'll see what happens. That's all I have.

Student Representatives to the Board Report - Ms. Jalah Cook commented good evening everyone, it's just me tonight. I want to start off by recapping some of the previous events from last month. Footloose, the musical, that we put on was a hit. It sold out all four night's and the audience really enjoyed you know the theater kids did a spectacular performance. Spring Dance, held by student council, it was a really good success. Students had a great time dressing up and dancing with their friends. Spring pep rally, I think this is like by far one of the best ones I've witnessed. A lot of students and teachers participated in the games that we held. That is it for the recap. Now onto this month's events. Senior Junior Prom is on Saturday, April 27th, at Twin Lakes. Student council is holding Spring blood drive on Thursday, April 11th from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m in the high school gymnasium. The career fair is Friday, April 19th. Palmer Township Police Department will be bringing their K9 unit for a performance and demonstrations from the dogs to the students. On Friday, April 5th, PA Career Link hosted a job fair workshop for seniors only to prepare them for the senior job fair in May. National Honor Society will be taking a trip to Six Flags on Monday, April 22nd. The high school art students are participating in the Women's Club of Slatington art contest. Students have submitted 33 pieces to be judged in the categories of 2D, 3D, fibers, photography, and poetry. Winners will be announced at an open reception on Monday, April 15th from 6:30 to 8:00p.m. at the Slatington Public Library. End of the third marking period was on April 2nd. April 16th, the high school will be having a motivational speaker, Tony Hoffmann, to speak to the students about drug addiction and mental health. LCTI, Nathan Farmer, won 3rd place in PA's FCCLA State Leadership Conference for PA meal planning. Ronald Verba participated in LCTI's FBLA competition and won 2nd place in regionals. Tonight, he will be competing for states, so we want to wish him good luck. Brayden Arnold was one of the 2 gold medalists in LCTI's Skills USA competition for motorcycle repair. He will travel to Atlanta, Georgia to compete in the USA national championships for the second time. We wish him a very good luck.

Ms. Cook commented now onto the sports report. Softball is one and one in their leagues and two and two overall. Baseball is 1 and 2 in their leagues and 1 and 3 overall. Boys track is 0 and 2 and girls track is 2 and 0. I have one more thing that I was not able to write down, it is in an email though. Aubrey Pollard was named Times News and Lehigh Valley Health Network's Athlete of Year and the Morning Call named her first team. That's all I have tonight and thank you.

Solicitor's Report - Attorney Roddick commented yes, just very briefly. Last month, in mid-March, the United States Supreme Court reviewed whether or not public officials can be sued for blocking users on their social media page. It's pages that are particularly ties to both personal as well as public information. There was a city manager who didn't like what an individual was posting about work-related matters on his social media page, so he deleted the comments and blocked that individual from commenting on his profile. That individual sued the city manager claiming that the city manager was violating his first amendment rights. So, what the court did was they kicked it back down to the circuit court and the circuit court needs to review whether or not the official's social media activity constituted state action. So, if the official had actual authority to speak on a particular subject and he purported to exercise that authority, in the relevant posts then you could be sued under a first amendment claim. If it is purely personal and you're not acting in your official capacity, the lawsuit could probably get kicked out. So, we'll keep you posted on that, but I think that's pretty important for school board members. Any questions?

Business Manager's Report - Mrs. Molitoris commented thank you. Last Tuesday evening we gave our kind of second look at our 24-25 budget during our finance committee meeting. Currently our budget is short \$1.28 million dollars, however, of that \$555,000, Administration is recommending using fund balance for one-time purchases. Those one-time purchases are things such as technology upgrades, some of the offset to the new ELA program we're looking at bringing into the district, our feasibility study, bond payments. We also are using some of our money set aside for PSERs and medical health increases. After we take off the \$555,000, we're still district short \$725,000. At that meeting, the board had asked what percentage of increase, if we did a two, two and a half, a three, and what kind of tax dollars and revenues would generate from that. A 2% increase would realize additional revenues of \$351,000, a 2.5% would be \$438,800, 3% would be \$526,600, 3.5% would be \$614,400, and 4% would be \$702,200. Again, at the May 6th Finance Committee meeting we will give our next presentation of the budget, adjusting revenues and expenditures. If we receive additional information that we can update our budget, at that point in time, we will. Keep in mind that in May is our open enrollment period for our employees to decide on their health insurance choices for next school year. So, that will change our budget depending upon those choices when we do the May final look at our budget presentation. Again, upon approval tonight of the board committee meeting minutes, the budget that was presented last Tuesday night, will be attached to those minutes for anybody in the community who wants to review that presentation. That is all I have for this evening.

Mr. Green commented just out of curiosity, and I'm sorry I missed your numbers. Currently, to balance our budget the way it stands, no additions, no corrections, no deletions, you're looking at what about a 4% increase, is that correct?

Mrs. Molitoris commented 4% would take you to the \$702,000 and we're 725 short.

Mr. Green commented so it's a bit over 4% as of this very moment.

Mrs. Molitoris commented correct.

Mr. Green commented thank you. That's all you have?

Mrs. Molitoris commented that is all I have.

Assistant Superintendent's Report - Dr. Stoker commented everybody's favorite part of the evening, the ESSER grant update. So, we have expended ESSER 1 and ESSER 2. ESSER 3, all parts of that are encumbered. With regard to ESSER 3, we paid salary and benefits again for administrator, kindergarten teacher, our technology integration specialist, ELDP staff, paraprofessionals, the nurse at Peters, and our mobile hotspots. With regard to after school, we've used that for tutoring at the secondary level. With learning loss and summer enrichment, there hasn't been any spending since last month. The next item on the agenda is our employee profile. Mr. Hass, if you can bring that up and I will turn it over to Dr. Link to begin.

Dr. Link commented so tonight as part of our kind of monthly board meeting update data reports, we'd like to share a little bit of information on the Northern Lehigh School District employee and staffing profile. So really this is going to be some general information about demographics of all of our employee groups throughout the school district. Powerpoint presentation displayed.

Mr. Fedorcha commented great report.

Mrs. Kulp commented yeah, nice information that we've never had before so that's great.

Dr. Stoker commented if I may just throw one more in there. One more plug, on April 23rd, 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. is our Barnes and Nobles night. It's a combined Title I night for our elementary schools and also Title III for ESL for K through 12, so if anyone fits that realm with their children, please come out on that evening and experience Barnes and Nobles night. There's a lot of really great activities. I know that our principals, Mr. Schnyderite and Mr. Breiner have been working with their Title I staff

Mrs. Kulp commented which Barnes and Nobles?

Dr. Stoker commented by the mall. I believe they moved though. That's all I have this evening, thank you.

Superintendent's Report - Dr. Link commented thank you, Mr. Green. I have a number of announcements and updates this evening. First, I'd like to extend my congratulations and gratitude to our Northern Lehigh Middle School What's So Cool About Manufacturing team for the video they produced for this year's competition. Mr. Hauser, Dr. Stoker and I had the pleasure of attending the What's So Cool About Manufacturing award ceremony. It proved to be a remarkable experience for our students. For the first time, the event was held at Stabler Events Center as it has outgrown its previous venue at the Steel Stacks in South Bethlehem. While the outcome may not have been what we had hoped for our team this year, please know we are immensely proud of the video they produced. Each student represented their classmates and the entire school district admirably showcasing essential skills such as teamwork, leadership, perseverance, and goal-setting. I trust that they found the experience rewarding and time well spent in crafting a product that both Northern Lehigh School District and B. Braun, who was their partner company this year, can take pride in. This year's What's So Cool About Manufacturing team members included Lauralie Ayala-Barreto, Ethan Binder, Bria Everett, Brooke Glaze, Charles Frystack, and Michael Pepe, and their advisor, Mrs. Mary Frank. Last week, Dr. Stoker and I had the privilege of witnessing one of our high school seniors, Ainsley Behr, being notified that Cedar Crest College had selected her as one of their scholarship award winners. A representative from Cedar Crest came to Northern Lehigh High School to present her with the scholarship which amounts to \$1,000 annually for 4 years. It was a true surprise for Ainsley, especially when she walked into the lobby and saw her parents and both of her siblings there waiting to congratulate her as well. It's always gratifying when our students are acknowledged for their hard work and we like to see that transition into higher education and the work force. Today, I had the pleasure of joining Mrs. Lori Geronikos, the President of the Northern Lehigh Education Foundation, at Neff's Bank to accept a check for \$25,000 from bank President, Mr. Kevin Schmidt and his team. This exceedingly generous donation is part of the educational improvement tax program, allowing businesses to support nonprofits such as our education foundation. The Foundation intends to utilize the donation to bolster the Northern Lehigh Summer STEAM Camp again this year. We have a lot of good news in my report, so I'm happy to share this out. This morning, we received notification from Mr. Chris Barnes, a Northern Lehigh high school english language arts teacher and advisor to The Slate, our high school newspaper was again selected to receive several notable awards from the Pennsylvania Press Association. So the awards are the following categories: editorial honorable mention for one step ahead a proactive response for school shootings, the feature story first place awarded to Lily Groover, for all they want they struggle of being an LGBTQ student at Northern Lehigh, that won first place. Cartooning and Art first place again awarded to Kiona Dyer for thinking about college and along for honorable mention for no pictures please. Then the single page front layout, so the single page award which is king of like one of the marquee awards again first place achieved by the editorial staff composed of Lily Groover, Susan Gilbach, Caitlyn Kirk and Maddie Mac. So again, congratulations to all the slate staff. And then, Jalah you beat me to it, I just want to reiterate that we're very proud of Aubrey Pollard who was named to the Times News Lehigh Valley Health Network Girls Basketball Player Athlete of the Year. This year she achieved 1,000 points ending her total career with 1,426 points. Additionally, she was recently honored as the MVP and Scholar Athlete of Lehigh Valley Senior All-Star Basketball Classic. She plans to continue her academic pursuits and basketball career at DeSales University. You can read more about Aubrey in today's Times News, they have a full page dedicated to her in the Times News today. So thank you also Jalah for bringing that up. That concludes my report for this evening.
