### THE MYP PROGRAM

The MYP is one program within the broader IB world, and is designed for scholars ages 11 through 16. It provides a framework of learning that encourages scholars to become creative, critical and reflective thinkers. It fosters the development of skills for communication, intercultural understanding and global engagement: essential qualities for young people who are becoming global leaders.

The MYP goal is to develop scholars who are:

- Active learners
- Internationally minded

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- Able the empathize with others
- Have the intellect and skills to pursue lives of meaning

#### What is Service Learning?

Service learning is an important component of the MYP Program. Experiences both during class and outside of school are appropriate in the MYP. The goal is for scholars to understand their capacity to make a meaningful contribution to their community and society. Through service learning, scholars develop and apply academic knowledge, personal skills and social skills in real-life situations involving decision-making, problem-solving, initiative, responsibility and accountability for their actions.

#### The Community Project

All scholars in the PVS MYP are required to complete a Community Project in the final year (Grade 8) of the program. The project begins by identifying an authentic community need and proposing action to address it. Scholars undertake the action, reflect on its success, and share their projects at a public showcase.The project allows scholars to choose a topic that interests them and connect it closely with a Global Context to support meaningful service action.

- Scientific and technical innovation
