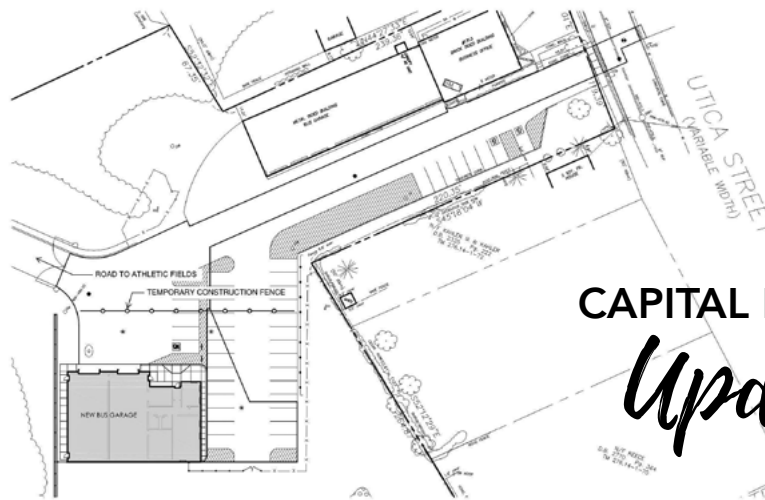

## CAPITAL PROJECT *Update*

Work on our Capital Project is well underway. The project will be constructed in two phases. Phase one is construction of a new bus garage. The bus garage will include a maintenance bay, wash bay, drivers' room and related space. The garage will be constructed in the southwest corner of the District office parking lot.

Construction is expected to begin this fall, pending approval from the State Education Department. In order to isolate the construction site from the existing parking area, a temporary construction fence will be erected as shown on the partial site plan.

Access to the upper soccer fields will be maintained, but the number of parking spaces will be reduced. Construction is expected to continue through the 2022-23 school year with completion of this phase in the summer of 2023.

Design work is progressing on phase two, which will include work at both schools. Major work items at the high school include updating the media center and kitchen/cafeteria, as well as window replacement. Major work items at the elementary school include boiler replacement, electrical upgrades, updated locker rooms and creation of a dedicated steam room.

Further updates on the Capital Project will be included in the next newsletter.

In his free time, Mr. Weigandt enjoys downhill skiing, golf, biking and gardening. He looks forward to joining the small town, close-knit Oriskany community.

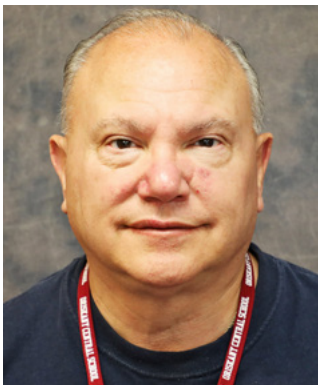


## Denise Mazza

Mr. Pohoreskey is excited to begin serving the Oriskany CSD. He has worked in law enforcement, security and has previously been a bus driver.

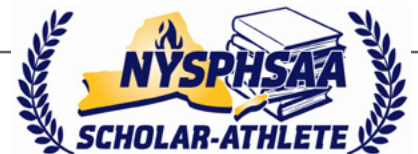

## Career Day

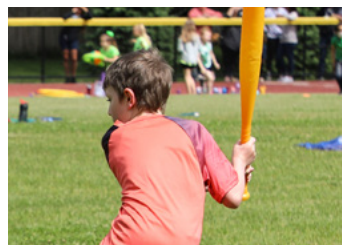

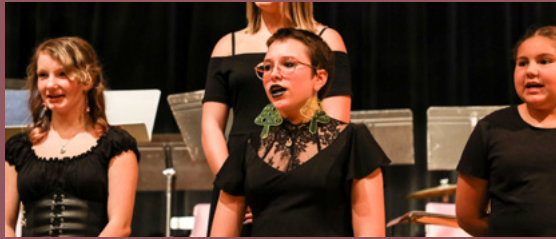
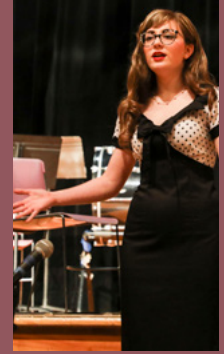




# Spring Concert

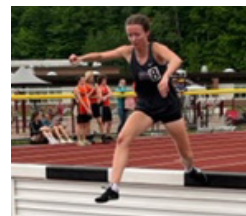
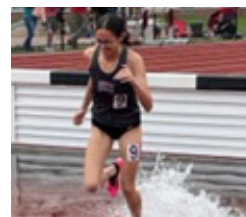
## TRACK & FIELD
