

February: Dental Health Month Mrs. DeFabio's Prek Class




















5th Graders learn about the Columbian Exchange

Students completed another escape room activity practicing math and ELA skills. Students worked hard and figured out it was the giraffe who had taken Cupid's Valentines.












Students had a great time participating in all the 100th Day activities.
