Since butter is such a staple at the Thanksgiving table, 1st graders learned how to make their own butter.
















Imagination and Engineering with 1st Grade Art Students










Cybersafety Internet Assembly

Don't take a picture or video, post to social media, email, text, type, or say anything that you would not want your parents, teachers, friends, future colleagues, or employers to see or hear.






Thank You, PTA!!

The PTA generously donated many toys, games, and crafts for students to use during inside recess days. We are all very grateful.
















Congratulations Mrs. Gray
