By using paper in a different way, traditional origami consists of folding a single sheet of square paper (often with a colored side) into a sculpture without cutting, gluing, taping, or even marking it. We made a few exceptions.

Students created a new building wide display in art class. It was inspired by our "Ride the Wave" theme, Robin Brickman's visit, and her use of paper.




Students created origami sea creatures. Origami is the art of paper-folding. Its name comes from the Japanese words ori ("folding") and kami ("paper").
