Students in Ms. Island's class had fun making 100 day posters. They created drawings of items that they would and would not want 100 of and even added 100 paint dots.












In 100 years I think these things will be different. I think desks will do your homework for you. Shoes will levitate in the air. Schools will have a pool and mermaids can teach us to swim.


If I'm still around, if this happens this will be cool. I will be 109 in 100 years and 2 months.


