Thanksgiving Giving Project


We donated two turkeys to Rome Rescue Mission as our giving project as we learned about being thankful and helping others in the community.

Trout in The Classroom is back!




Mr. Bartell, a member of Trout Unlimited, helps out with our trout in the classroom. He also works with other local schools.

They separated the candies by color and had to list what they were thankful for based on their colors.








Veterans Day Assembly
