As we approach the first quarter of our school year, we thank you, our parents and guardians, instructional staff, and support staff for our successful return to in-person learning. We are in the process of bringing back several programs designed for your students with our COVID protocols in place. Please find below information on some of those programs and activities.

This newsletter will help you recognize those programs and also guide you for the dates and times of our future activities. Important items include our parent - teacher conferences and our PTA annual book fair..

We are also beginning our Social Emotional Learning activities that will take place in our classrooms and carried out by our Guidance Counselors and Social Workers. These activities will help students in their classroom programs and also their interactions with peers during their time not only in school but also in our school community.

We will also welcome several student teachers from both Utica College and SUNY Oneonta for the spring semester. They will be working under the direction of our instructional staff and will be able to offer additional support to our students.

## Message from the Kindergarten team ...






#### Zero the Hero

A fun and informative week for students at NA Walbran learning about fire safety.
















## 2nd Grade...Mrs. Zarnoch-Riley's Class

## 2nd Grade...Ms. Island's Class










#### 5th/6th Grade ELA...Mrs. Caruso's Class





For the October book report, students could read any book of their choice as long as it related to Halloween. Students were then given the opportunity to present their book to the class.



Each week the PPS team pushes into classes to teach social-emotional learning to the students. This past week, Ms. Bostic talked to the students about the many different emotions we experience and how our bodies feel with each emotion. To help Ms. Bostic get to know the 6th graders, she had them toss the ball to one another to take turns playing charades. They were asked to say their name and the activity they enjoy doing the most in their free time.

### Art Special...Mrs. Jordan



Second graders used paper plates and fluorescent paint to make tropical fish. Starfish were given dimension and sparkle by fifth graders. Pre-k "fed" their bottle fish with tissue paper to give them color. Shells were created by prek students who used model magic and plastic molds. Acrylic turtle paintings on canvas boards were made by sixth graders. Beaded wire fish sculptures on a seaweed base were sculpted by first graders. The work of Alexander Calder inspired the first graders. Sand is at the bottom of the ocean which was added to drawings by fifth graders.

This year's school theme is "Ride the Wave." Students worked individually and then together in art classes to create water related displays.



Mrs. Brown and Mr. Enos created a ride the wave board for PE. Third graders got on board by designing and displaying surfboards.



Third graders upcycled plastic water bottles and used colored wire and sharpies to create 3D jellyfish. Students decided where on the board to place each creation.
