<u>PRE-K GRADE</u>







Students also have enjoyed observing a mini-ecosystem that is the home to their Betta-fish named "Cupcake" and two snails named "Tom" and "Jerry".




2ND GRADE

Freddy Smith is a 3rd grader in Ms. Seamon's class. Congratulations, Freddy!


