
A note from the Principal

Dear Students and Parents/Guardians,

I can't believe it is already November. I want to thank the teachers, students, parents/caregivers and the community for such a great fall. The end of the 1st Marking Period is November 10th. Students will be able to take advantage of extra help from certified teachers on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3-5pm. Pizza is provided, and there will be a 5 o'clock bus run that all students staying after can take advantage of. Students are also encouraged to stay with their teachers during the 2:30-2:55 activity period each day.

Also, I want to congratulate our fall student athletes for a great season both on and off the field. The combined Westmo /Oriskany Boys' Soccer team, the combined Oriskany/Westmo Cheer team, Cross Country team and our Gymnastics team all made sectionals this year. I also want to thank Mr. Buck for his leadership in helping our student athletes.

It has been great getting back to normalcy and having field trips again. On October 11th, the 9th graders went on a field trip to SUNY Poly. Our students engaged in breakout sessions designed to empower students to explore the power of reconnection and the importance of building resilience. Our students also had the the privilege of hearing a joint Keynote address by two very special guests; Erin Gruwell, Teacher, Author, and Founder of the Freedom Writers Foundation and Liz Murray, Co-founder of the Arthur Project and Inspirational Speaker and Best Selling Author of "Breaking Night: My Journey from Homeless to Harvard". On October 25th, our 8th graders toured the CTE programs at BOCES. This is a career exploration and helps with future high school planning.

On November 2nd, 10th graders will also be going on group tours for career exploration . The class is broken up into 6 different groups. Three groups go in the morning and three groups go in the afternoon. The clusters are healthcare, communications/journalism, advanced manufacturing, animal science, law enforcement/human and public service, and construction/skill building trades. All students were able to get their first choice. Senior shadowing will take place on November 15th. This does not include students already at BOCES or New Visions because they already get internships through their programs.

The 7th grade physical science students participated in a lab experiment, where they observed & created chemical reactions with common cooking ingredients, and regular house products such as milk and vinegar.



The Regents Physics class observed a series of demonstrations involving the nail-bed. The first few demonstrations dealt with force and pressure. Students observed that when a force is applied over a larger area, the pressure is less than when the same force is applied to a small area. The more nails available to support the teacher, the more weight she can support without injury. It is note-worthy that, we often associate only "warm, fuzzy" personality traits with a "supportive" environment, but here students observed that even "cool, prickly" nails, were able to provide the support necessary to distribute a large stress and reduce pressure.

The picture was taken during the next part of the lesson, in which students witnessed the principal, Mr. Kennedy, smash the block with a sledge hammer. This was a phenomenon used to introduce students to investigations about momentum, impulse, forces and inertia. Students were asked to consider what it is about the sledge hammer that presented a threat to the teacher and how did the interaction between the block and the hammer reduce the threat to the teacher.

-Let cool then eat!






