


















Red Ribbon Week takes place each year from October 23 through 31st. Join us in our MISSION to help keep kids drug free.

JUNIORS take the PSAT/NMSQT

- 11th graders will take the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT), which will be administered on October 12, 2022. The benefits of taking the PSAT include the following:
- 1. It provides practice for taking the S.A.T., which most juniors will take for the first time in the Spring 2023.
- 2. Students can predict their S.A.T. scores from the PSAT/NMSQT scores. This information will be helpful this year as students explore colleges and consider the admission requirements of particular schools.
- 3. Students may choose to participate in a service that will forward their names to various colleges that are seeking students like them. Then they will receive information from these colleges.
- 4. Students are automatically entered in scholarship competitions by taking the PSAT/NMSQT.
- 5. Scores on the PSAT will indicate if students have the reading and math skills they need for college.

As stated earlier, the PSAT will help prepare for the SAT which the Juniors should take in the Spring. If you do not perform as well as you would have liked to in the Spring, you will have the opportunity to take the SAT over again in the Fall. Selective Service Registration

May I have your attention please!!! I have an important announcement for all 17 – and – 18 year-old males. If you are within 30 days of your 18th birthday, federal law requires you to register with Selective Service.

Registering with Selective Service allows you to receive federal student loans for college, participate in federal job training programs, and have the opportunity to work in the federal government. If you do not register with Selective Service, you will lose out on these things and more.

Registering with Selective Service is simple and easy. Registering with Selective Service within 30 days of your 18th birthday is the law! Just fill out and return the registration card you receive in the mail or go to the post office down the street and fill out a form there. Even better, save a stamp. Save time. Register on-line. Use the internet to register at: www.sss.gov.





This extension applies through the fall 2023 and spring 2024 cycles.

If you believe your scores are an accurate representation of your ability, SUNY colleges can consider them along with all other materials in your application file. If you think your scores do not represent your abilities, SUNY colleges can holistically evaluate your application without considering them. Please consult your school counselor or advisor if you are unsure about what to do.


SUNY will maintain its longstanding commitment to holistic review of applications that includes grades, program of study, exam scores, academic achievements, non-academic achievements, and other activities

Commended Students in the 2023 National Merit Scholarship Program
