




Alex Wlock & Skylar Albin both made it on the OHM Boces February CTE Bulletin.

#### More Language Club

















On February 28th members of Language Club continued working alongside the staff at Eastern Star Daycare Center to introduce basic vocabulary within their language of study through the use of songs, stories and mini lessons. This past month students worked on numbers and colors to create Valentines Day hearts celebrating heart month.









The seventh graders wrapped up their simple machine unit by creating marshmallow launchers. They were given a cup, a utensil, tape, a classroom full of other materials, and a marshmallow. They were told they had to make a lever. They had to take their inventions and try to launch marshmallows at me, while I sat on my front desk with a target. They were given 11 trials to make adjustments to their launcher and try to hit the target. While making their adjustments they had to draw their launcher and identify three components: the fulcrum (fixed point that the lever rotates on), the output force (how the marshmallow leaves the lever), and the input force (the force they put on the lever). They enjoyed this lab because they got to be creative and work with classmates for one common goal, aim their marshmallow at the teacher! Students recently had the task of finding and identifying simple machines (levers, pully, screws, inclined planes, wedges, and wheels with axles) around them that they use every day.






#### **Future Business Leaders of America**






## Valentine's Day Selfie Wall
