FOOTNOTE: These are SJUSD board policies. Please refer to Board Policy 5132 - Dress and Grooming.

Uniforms are required on all school days, with the exception of Spirit Days. Students who have earned a free-dress pass may use it on specific days. Students who are not in uniform will be lent clothing items.

Hoover's uniform closet has been established for families that need assistance. Hoover families are encouraged to donate/exchange uniforms that are in good condition to our uniform closet.



Hoover Electronic Device Policy



Cell phones and other personal electronic devices may be used by students outside during brunch and lunch in accordance with district technology guidelines. Phones should be **put away upon entering any school building.** Phones may only be out during class time when being used for school-related tasks or as determined by the teacher or other district employee.

When using ANY device, students must ALWAYS follow all district technology guidelines, including:

- ★ respect and practice the principles of community by communicating only in ways that are kind and respectful
- ★ respect and protect the privacy of others by NOT photographing or video recording others

- First Time Violation: Warning and reminder of policy and expectations
- **Second Time Violation:** Student gives device to staff member and the student may retrieve the device after the school day

TECHNOLOGY USE

San José Unified technology resources are provided to our students and employees for educational purposes only. These resources include district-provided devices, email, district-provided Google Workspace for Education accounts, internet access, and district-supported applications. The Technology Use policy applies to district-provided devices and personal devices, including phones, tablets, and laptops, that connect to our wireless networks. Students who violate this policy may lose access to their district-provided device and the school network and may be fined for repair/replacement costs.

Students who bring personal devices to school assume all liability and risk for damage to the device. Personal devices may connect to the wireless guest network available at all schools and offices. Only district-provided devices may connect to San José Unified's main wireless network. District-provided devices receive bandwidth priority over personal devices.

District-Provided Devices

All San José Unified students in grades K – 12 are eligible to receive an iPad or a Chromebook for school use. Students are responsible for the proper care of their device and its accessories (charger, keyboard/case), including transporting the device between home and school. In the event a device requires repair or replacement, the parent/guardian or student should contact the school and provide details about how the damage to the device happened. Students may be fined to cover the repair/replacement costs of the device or its accessories.

Device and Network Filtering

All San José Unified student devices are restricted from accessing inappropriate content or online pages that do not have an educational purpose. As the internet continually evolves, our Technology Services team continues to update the categories of content that are on the restricted list. The following types of content are examples of restricted content on student devices when connected to the San José Unified network: adult content, gaming-only sites with no educational purpose, alcohol and drugs, making or buying weapons, hate speech, and social media (excluding YouTube).

Regardless of the device used to access San José Unified resources, students must:

Respect and protect the privacy of others.

- Use only assigned accounts
- Not view, use, or copy passwords, data, or networks for which they are not authorized
- Not distribute private information about others or themselves

Respect and protect the integrity, availability, and security of all electronic resources.

- Observe all network security practices, as posted
- Report security risks or violations to a teacher or network administrator
- Not destroy or damage data, networks, or other resources that do not belong to them, without clear permission
 of the owner
- Not modify settings on district-issued devices such as using proxy servers or VPNs
- Conserve, protect, and share these resources with other students and Internet users

Respect and protect the intellectual property of others.

- Not infringe upon copyright laws (no illegal copies of music, games, or movies)
- Not plagiarize

Respect and practice the principles of community.

- Communicate only in ways that are kind and respectful
- Report threatening materials directed at staff, students, or community members to a teacher or administrator
- Not intentionally access, transmit, copy, or create material that violates the school's code of conduct (such as messages that are pornographic, threatening, rude, discriminatory, or meant to harass)
- Not intentionally access, transmit, copy, or create material that is illegal (such as obscenity, stolen materials, or illegal copies of copyrighted works)
- Not use the resources to further other acts that are criminal or violate the school's code of conduct
- Not send spam, chain letters, or other mass unsolicited mailings
- Not buy, sell, advertise, or otherwise conduct business, unless approved as a school project



TECHNOLOGY USE

Consequences for Violation

Upon discovery through monitoring software or other methods, violations of these rules will be reported to the site administrator and may result in disciplinary action, including the loss of a student's privileges to use the district's IT resources (i.e. disabling of accounts, elimination of access to technology and technology platforms). Other disciplinary actions may be taken in accordance with California Education Code (EC) and San José Unified policy.

Supervision and Monitoring

School and network administrators and their authorized employees monitor the use of IT resources to ensure that uses are secure and in conformity with this policy. Administrators reserve the right to examine, use, and disclose any data found on the school's information networks to further the health, safety, discipline, or security of any student or other person, or to protect property. They may also use this information in disciplinary actions and will furnish evidence of crime to law enforcement.

Social Media Use

The United States Surgeon General issued an advisory in May of 2023 on the Effects Social Media Use Has on Youth Mental Health. The advisory stated, "... there is growing evidence that social media use is associated with harm to young people's mental health." San José Unified restricts all social media sites and applications on district-provided student devices. Students who bring personal devices, such as phones or tablets, will not be restricted from accessing social media sites on those devices while at school.

2024-2025 Volunteer Policies

San José Unified appreciates the valuable contributions of our volunteers. Following is our polices and legal requirements for volunteering at our site.

Who needs to be registered as a volunteer? Any adult over the age of 18, if driving students, who voluntarily offers a service to the school district without compensation on a regular basis (whether short- or long-term) must complete the volunteer form(s), be fingerprinted, submit a completed tuberculosis (TB) clearance, and any additional documents required as a volunteer driver to the Human Resources Department.

How do I become a volunteer?

If you have not been a registered volunteer with San José Unified in the prior two years, please follow the steps below:

- 1. Complete this online application.
- 2. Complete a tuberculosis (TB) test no more than 60 days prior to the submission of your volunteer application. The TB clearance must be valid for the entire school year in which you are volunteering.
- 3. Email your TB clearance to volunteer@sjusd.org.
- 4. Once Human Resources verifies your TB clearance, you will be invited for a fingerprint appointment at the District Office. These appointments are by invitation only.
- 5. Once your fingerprints have cleared through the Department of Justice and FBI, you will receive an auto-confirmation email that you are cleared to volunteer.
- 6. After being cleared by the District, all volunteers need to be approved by the site Principal.

If you also plan to drive students in your volunteer role, please follow the steps below annually:

- 1. Maintain your California Driver's License submit a new copy upon renewal.
- 2. Request the Volunteer Driver Packet by emailing volunteer@sjusd.org.
- 3. Email the following to volunteer@sjusd.org
 - a. The completed Volunteer Driver Form
 - b. Proof of automobile insurance coverage with a limit of not less than \$100,000 injury/death to one person and \$300,000 injury/death to more than one person. This can be found on the declaration page of your policy. Validity must be maintained, and a new declaration page of your policy must be submitted upon renewal.
 - c. A copy of the vehicle's insurance card including expiration date, validity must be maintained. A new card must be submitted upon insurance renewal.
 - d. A copy of the vehicle's registration, validity must be maintained. A new registration must be submitted upon
 - e. Provide an official DMV Driver's Record (K4) for at least the past 3 years. This report will be good for 1 year from the date you receive it.
 - f. Submit the DMV Pull Notice Program Authorization for Release of Driver Record Information form as a volunteer driver with San José Unified School District.
- 4. Once your fingerprints have cleared through the Department of Justice and FBI, and Human Resources receives your TB Clearance and all items listed in 3a-3e you will receive an email confirmation that you are cleared to be a volunteer driver.

What do I need to do if I am a returning volunteer?

Our volunteers must register with the Human Resources department each year. To do so please complete this online application. Volunteer Drivers must complete the Volunteer Driver Packet including resubmit items in 3a-3e above each year. This ensures we know who is actively working with our students and staff, and at which sites. It also ensures we have your up-to-date contact information. Returning volunteers do not need to complete fingerprinting but may need to submit an updated TB clearance. This packet includes the district's policies on sexual harassment and child abuse reporting for your review.






