

EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR (ESY) 2024

July 8-July 26, 2024 Monday-Friday 8:00 am-1:00 pm

LOCATIONS: Elementary- West Liberty, Secondary- South Brook

ELEMENTARY: The focus of the elementary ESY program will be ESY-identified IEP (Individualized Education Program) goals in reading, math, communication and socialization skills. Upper elementary grades will be able to experience community-based instruction weekly. Families and school teams will receive program data for all students in attendance. There will be a variety of community partnerships this summer! We are excited for the Pittsburgh Fire Department, Reading is Fundamental, Pittsburgh Police, Creative Melodies, Alcosan and several others join us this summer!

SECONDARY: Community Based Instruction that includes lessons on accessing public transportation, exploring community service sites, and completing tasks such as grocery shopping. Community Based Vocational Education where students pursue occupational interests and obtain training in real-life work environments. **Daily Living Skills** that students need for independence such as cooking, cleaning, laundry, and personal care. **Academic Skills** will be incorporated into daily activities such as following a recipe, reading a bus schedule, identifying signs, etc. Students will be working on resumes, interest surveys and have weekly speakers from OVR, independent community living and more!

CENTER-BASED SCHOOLS: **Pittsburgh Pioneer's** ESY program is a fun-filled, therapeutic educational experience for students. You will find students in our expansive outdoor Sensory Garden daily. Staff incorporates academic and therapy goals based on IEP objectives into activities such as biking, outside walks, swinging, picnics, and engaging in water and sports activities.

The ESY program for **Pittsburgh Conroy** provides a summer filled with fun and learning with themebased activities focused on IEP goals. Students also take part in various enrichment activities, including band, magic shows, student karaoke, and friendly competitions.

Pittsburgh Oliver Citywide Academy will utilize its previous space and swimming pool again this summer. Continued focus on reading, math, socialization, and vocational programming will occur daily.

CITY CONNECTIONS: Pittsburgh Public Schools offers an innovative service delivery model for students with disabilities age 18-21 at the City Connections ESY program. Students participate in a community-based, transition focused learning and working environment. The City Connections ESY sites are in apartment and college campus settings to allow students to access work and real-life activities in a community setting. The ESY program is focused on transition outcomes including post-secondary education and training, employment and community living.

Summer B.O.O.S.T: Grades K-7; The program is designed to support students by building positive relationships and creating opportunities for exploration that put youth on track for their future academic success in a thriving and fun environment. Monday - Friday 8:00am - 3:30pm June 26 through July 26

ESY options for non-district summer programs are reviewed and considered on a case-by-case basis. To be considered, these programs must provide services and collect data that aligns with IEP goals designated for ESY.
