District Assessment System

- Replaced the district assessment system starting 2019-20
 - Eliminate Quarterly assessments
 - Eliminate Predictive assessments (with the exception of Science)
 - Where possible replace existing diagnostic tests for use with online platforms (Mathematics - Edmentum)
- Collect Diagnostic information that is comparable
 - Across grade levels
 - Between assessments (growth)
 - Consistent assessment K-12 for ELA and Mathematics
 - Program agnostic

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NWEA MAP Assessment

- District assessments how many we reduced –
 - What information is provided
 - Standards (PA aligned k-12)
 - Projected performance (PSSA, ACT and SAT)
 - Reading information (RIT scores, Standards, Lexiles, growth projections)
 - Mathematics information (RIT Scores, standards growth projections)
 - Science (RIT Score, 3-8 PA standards)

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First stages of Implementation – NWEA MAP

Schedule:

- First window Sept 3rd –Oct 4th
- Second window Nov 25th-Dec 20th
- Third window (starting Feb 21)

Training

- Initial proctoring training provided to Coaches to support the first round of testing
- Follow-up training on reports and usage of results to coaches and curriculum leads

Next Stages of Implementation

Planning:

1. Working with School Assessment Coordinators (SACs) to establish a preliminary testing schedule/plan for the first window (beginning of year)
2. Identify training needs based on feedback from Principals, SACs, Curriculum dept, and Teachers
3. Work to identify the SACs for each school earlier in the school year.

Training (what we would like to do)


- Training for the 2020-21 school year for teachers, principals
 - Use of results to assist in differentiation
 - Use of reports
 - Connection to curriculum

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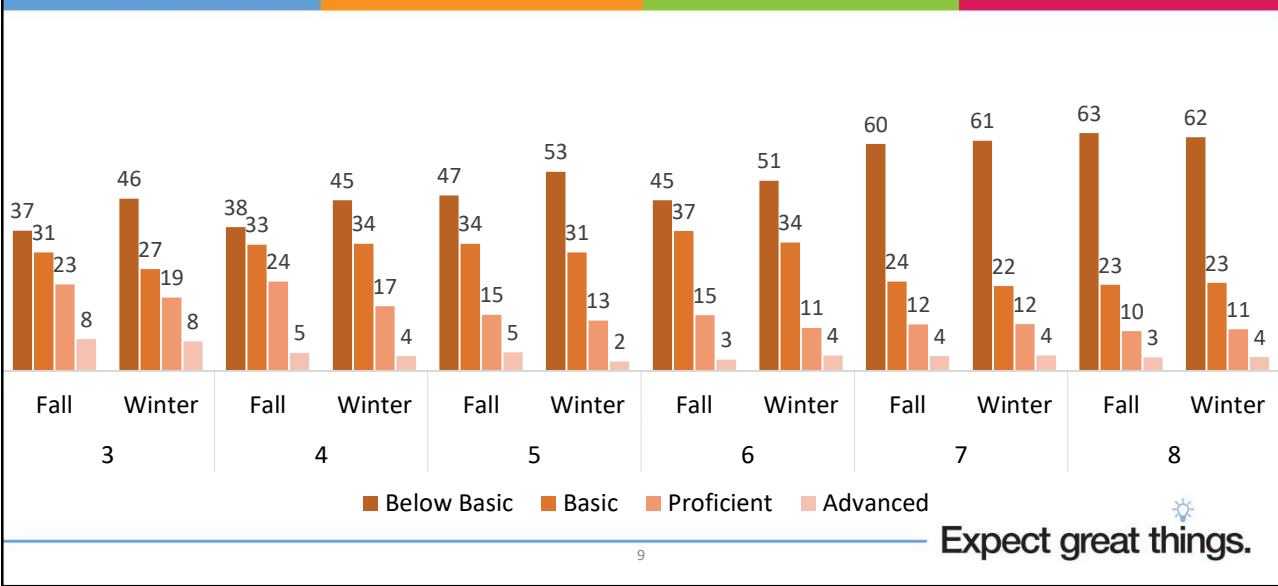

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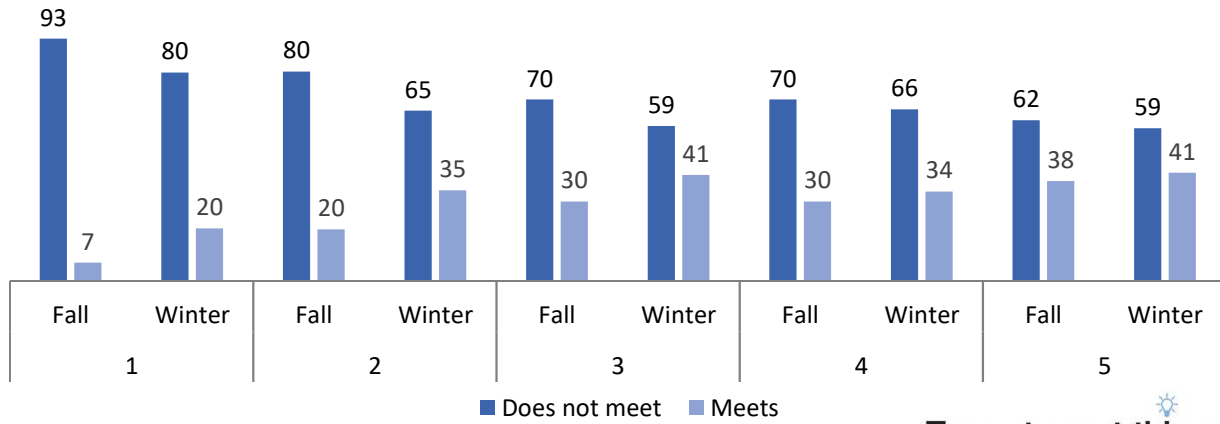
Percent of students at projected PSSA reading performance level, by grade SY 2019-20 fall and winter results

 - The Lexile Framework for Reading (by MetaMetrics)
 - A single measure of a text’s complexity
 - Provides a holistic Quantitative metric for student reading ability

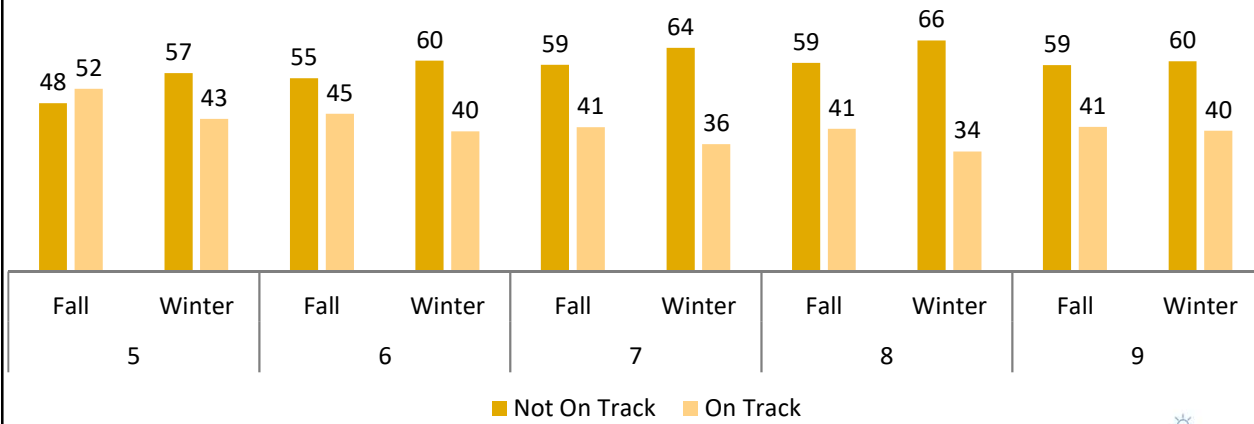
Percent of students at reading lexile category, by grade (1-5) SY 2019-20 fall and winter results

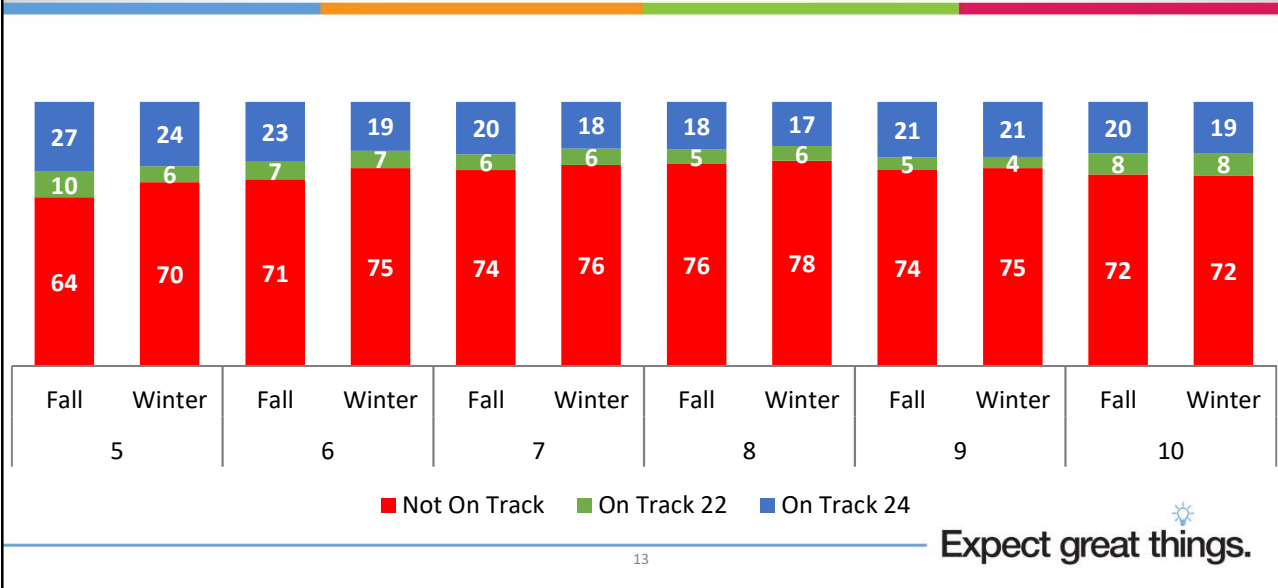
Percent of students at projected SAT reading readiness level, by grade SY 2019-20 fall and winter results
