Causes for Non-Renewal:

1. One or more material violations of any of the conditions, standards, or procedures contained in the written charter signed pursuant to section 1720-A
2. Failure to meet the requirements for student performance set forth in 22 Pa.Code Ch. 5 (relating to curriculum) or subsequent regulations promulgated to replace 22 Pa. Code Ch. 5 or failure to meet any performance standard set forth in the written charter signed pursuant to section 1716-A*
3. Failure to meet generally accepted standards of fiscal management or audit requirements
4. Violation of provisions of this article (the Charter School Law)
5. Violation of any provision of law from which the charter school has not been exempted, including Federal laws and regulations governing children with disabilities
6. The charter has been convicted of fraud.

*Ch. 5 of the PA Code has been repealed and replaced by Ch. 4 (relating to Academic Standards and Assessment).

Review Process

- Annual site visits over term of charter
- Renewal visit – up to entire school day
- Review team meeting to discuss findings in terms of criteria
- Findings presented to the Board on June 12, 2019.
- Board votes on June 19, 2019.

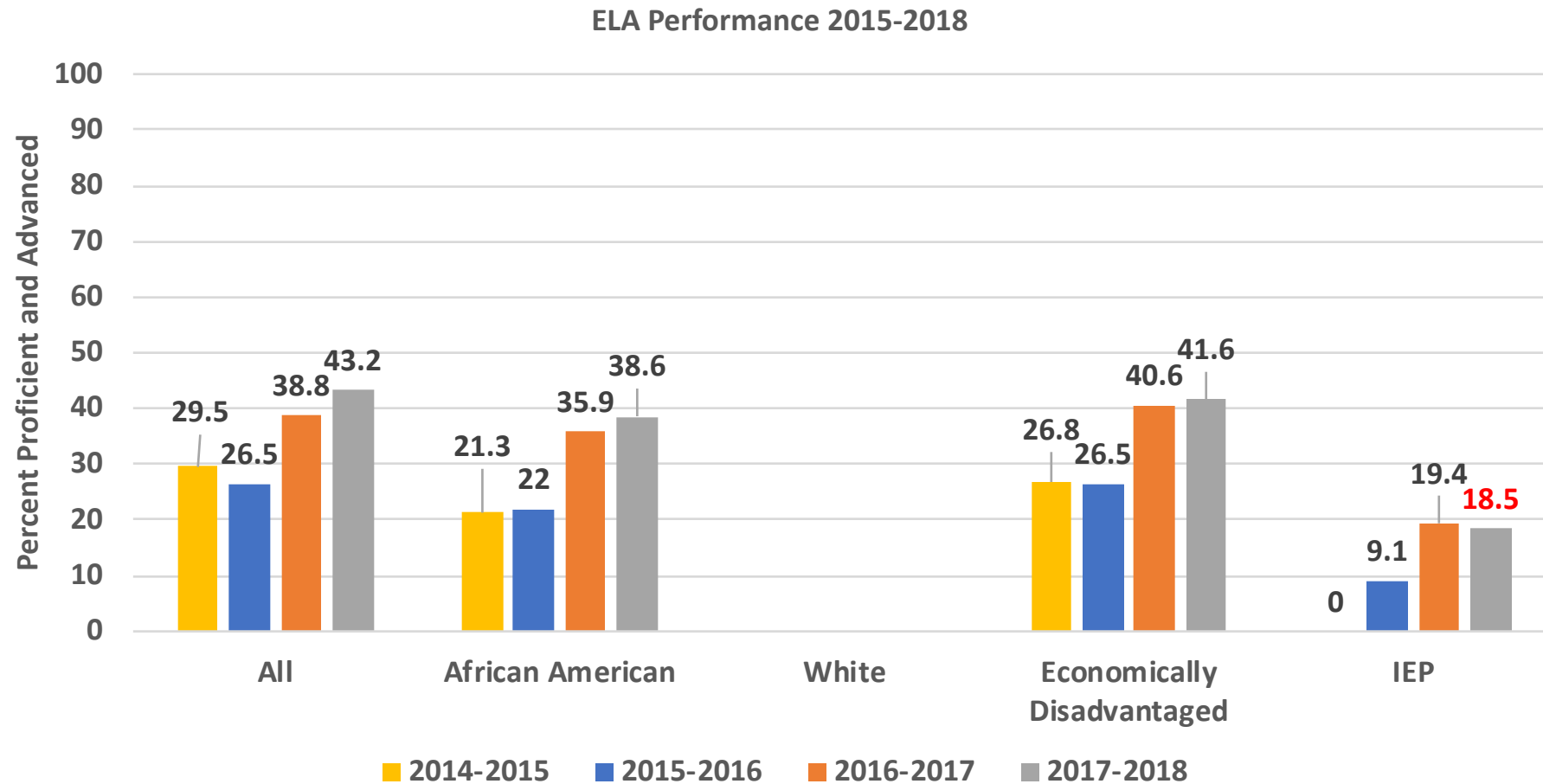

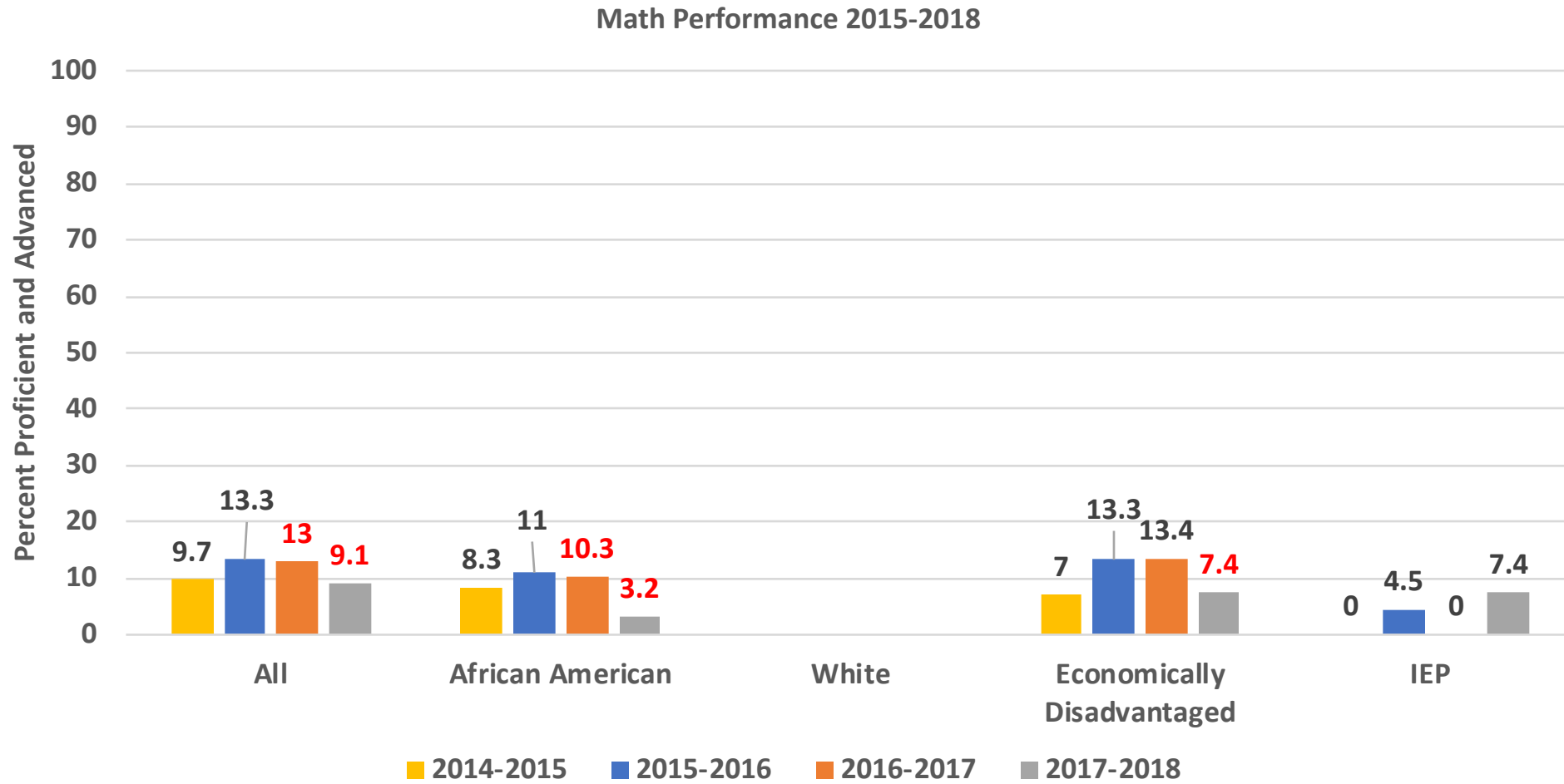
Propel – Hazelwood Performance - ELA

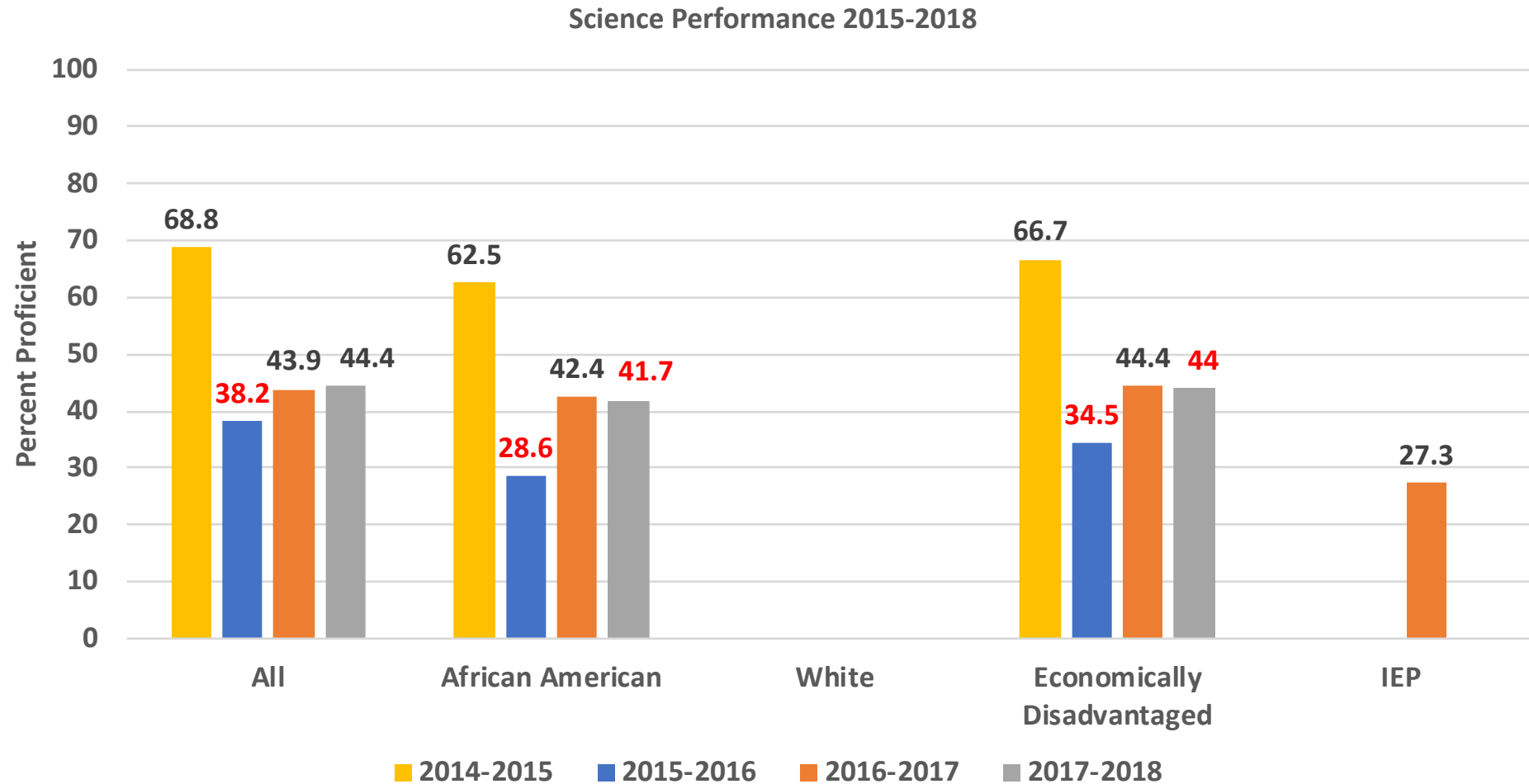
Propel – Hazelwood Performance - Math

Propel Hazelwood Findings

1. No material violations of any of the conditions, standards, or procedures contained in the written charter signed pursuant to section 1720-A
2. Has not met requirements for student performance in all areas:
 - Low achievement and declines in math proficiency over the past three years for all subgroups with data
 - Declines in science proficiency for African American and Economically Disadvantaged students
 - Declines in ELA proficiency for students with an IEP
3. Meets generally accepted standards of fiscal management and audit requirements
4. No violations of provisions of this article (the Charter School Law)
5. No violation of any provision of law from which the charter school has not been exempted, including Federal laws and regulations governing children with disabilities
6. The charter school has not been convicted of fraud.

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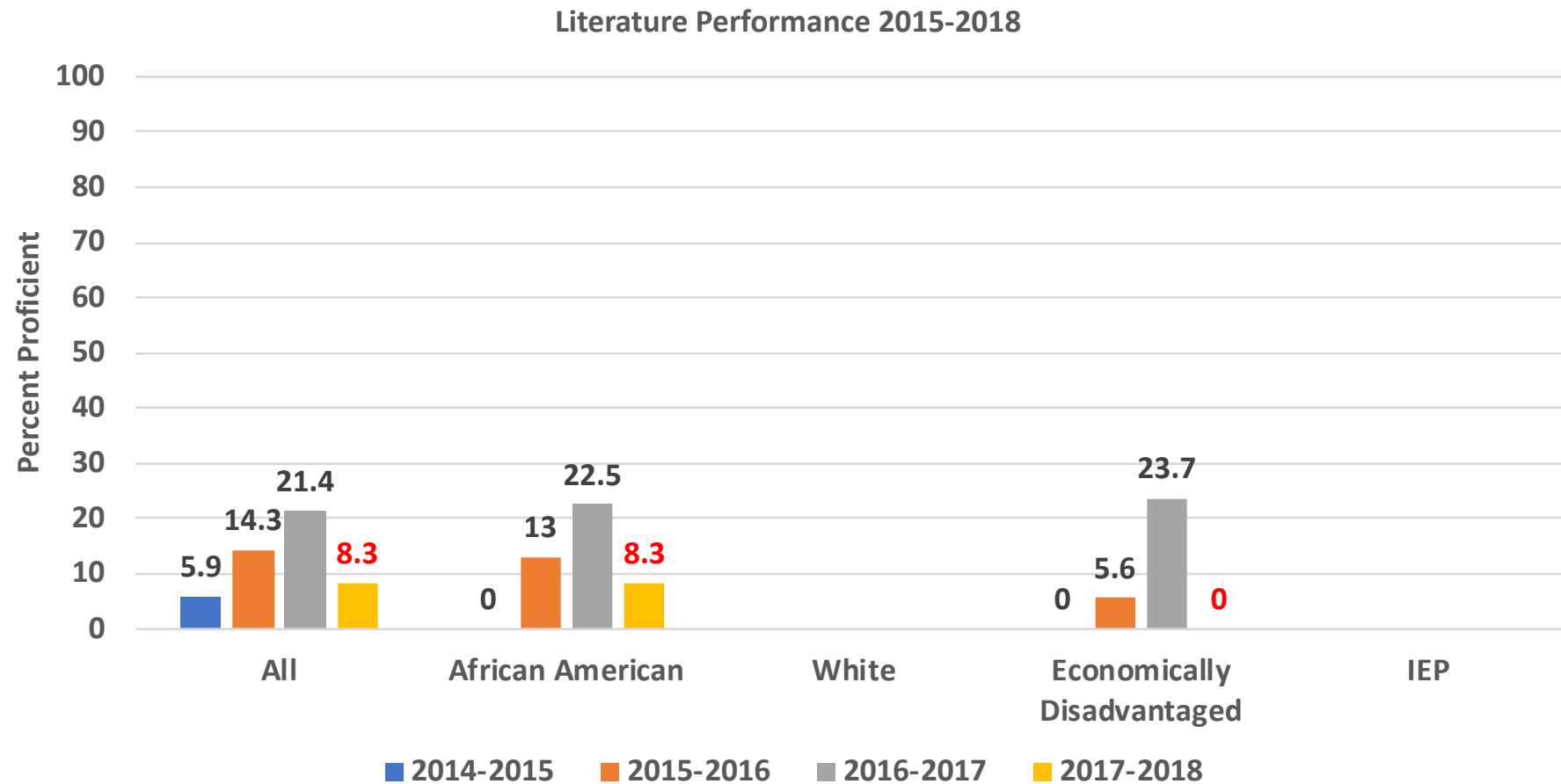

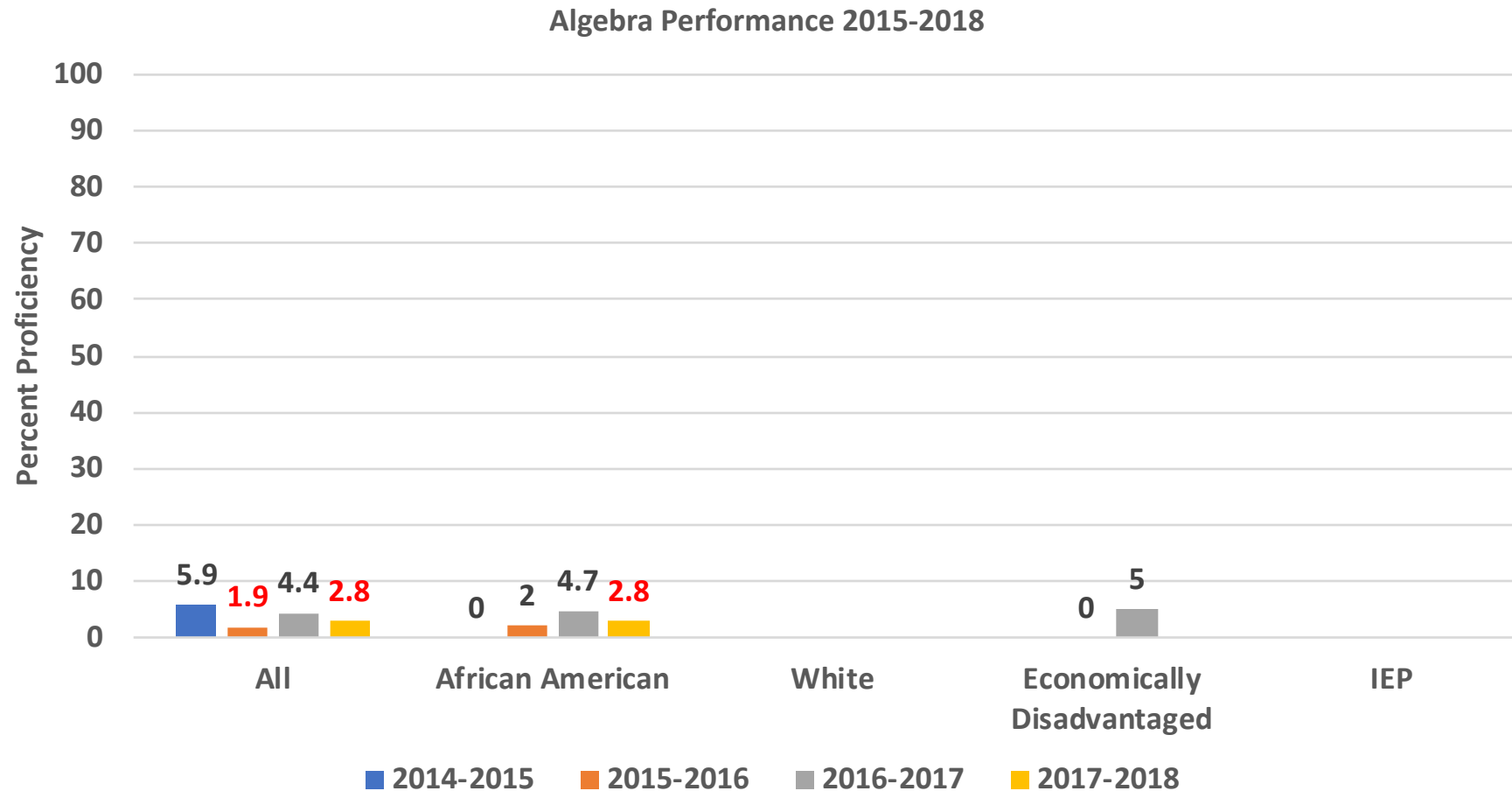
HHPACS Performance - Literature

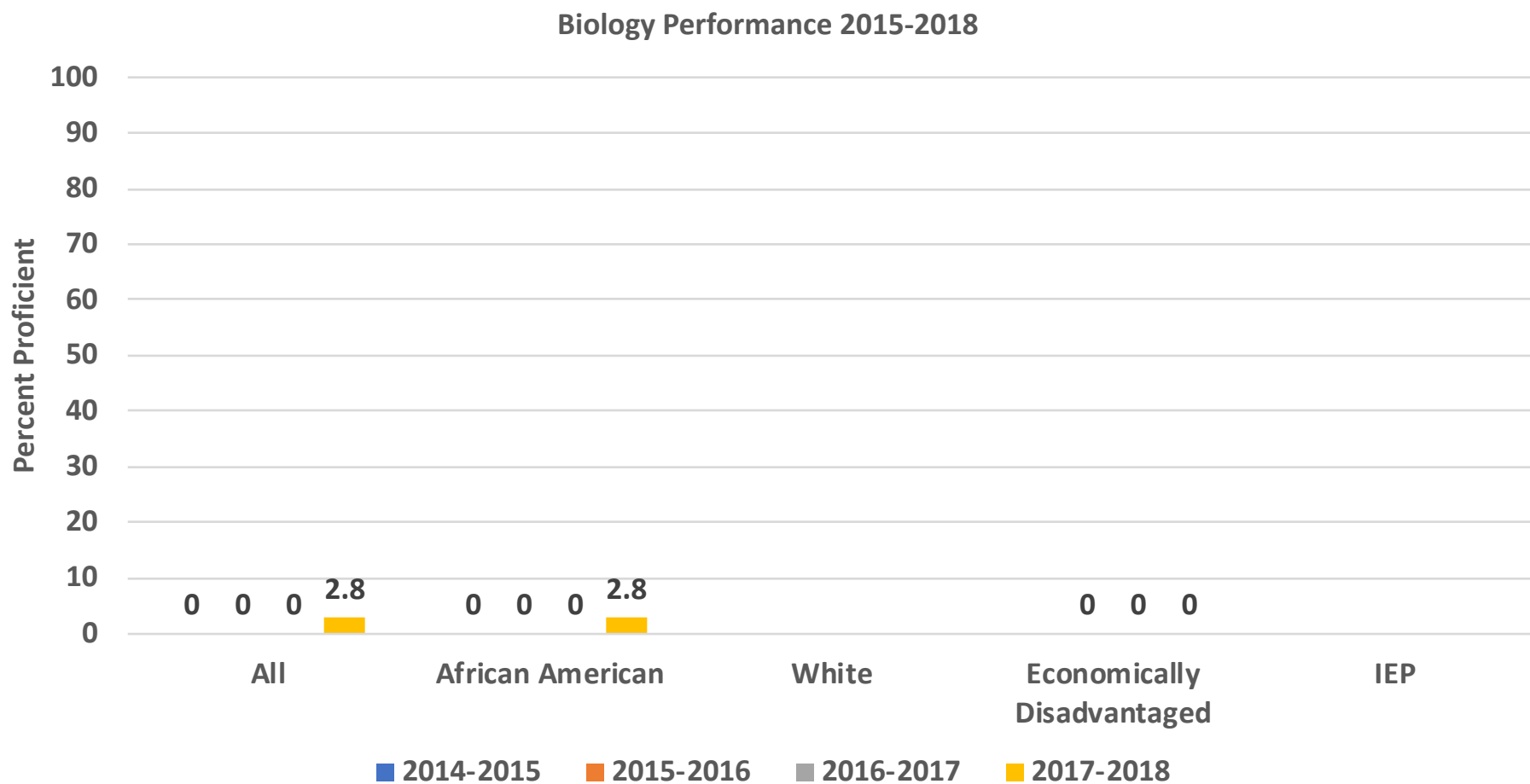
HHPACS Performance - Algebra

HHPACS Findings

1. One or more violations of any of the conditions, standards, or procedures contained in the written charter signed pursuant to section 1720-A
 - Enrollment of students under the statutory age 17
 - Not adhering to agreement reached between the charter school and the District
 - Signed affidavit submitted with enrollment of any student under 17 years of age
2. Failure to meet the requirements for student performance set forth in 22 Pa. Code Ch. 5 (relating to curriculum) or subsequent regulations promulgated to replace 22 Pa. Code Ch. 5 failure to meet any performance standard set forth in the written charter signed pursuant to section 1716-A
 - Significantly low and declining proficiency rates across all three content areas
 - Declining School Performance Profile score
 - Curriculum not aligned to PA Core Standards



HHPACS Findings

3. Failure to meet generally accepted standards of fiscal management or audit requirements
 - 100% Debt to Asset ratio – more debts than assets
 - Negative operating cash flow, -\$83,617
4. No violation of provisions of this article (the Charter School Law)
5. No violation of any provision of law from which the charter school has not been exempted, including Federal laws and regulations governing children with disabilities
6. The charter school has not been convicted of fraud.

Renewal Term and Agreement

- 1-year renewal does not apply to the School District of Pittsburgh.
- If renewed for a 5-year term, charter agreement will include goals and stipulations for improvements.
- Charter must meet goals and stipulations for subsequent renewals.

HHPACS Amendment Requests

- Relocation: from 510 Heldman Street to 933 Penn Avenue
- Name change: from Hill House Passport Academy Charter School to Passport Academy Charter School
 - Both requests due to dissolution of the Hill House Association
 - Current lease not renewable
 - 2nd and 3rd floors of 933 Penn Ave, across from Urban Pathways 6-12 and next to Urban Pathways K-5
 - Site inspection performed by the District – sufficient with minor recommendations
 - **Lease available prior to Board vote**
 - School no longer affiliated with the Hill House Association
