

Benchmarking and Research from Other Districts

- We reviewed Code of Conduct documents as well as disciplinary policies and practices of other school districts (exemplars: Oakland, Houston, Louisville, Baltimore, Philadelphia).
- Here's what we found:
 - Extensive school-based supports were instituted
 - 4 to 5 levels of infractions, interventions, and disciplinary actions
 - Non-violent out-of-school suspensions explicitly limited or prohibited for elementary grades
 - Changed board policy for suspensions
 - Intentional parent and family engagement regarding awareness, shared responsibility, and shared ownership of Code of Conduct




Top Categories by Stakeholder Group



Summary of Recommended Changes

Informed by...

- Forum Feedback
- Benchmarking and research from other districts
- Internal cross-functional teams
- Review of current disciplinary practices
- Legal requirements

Summary of Recommended Changes

- Strengthened emphasis on culture and climate
 - Student, staff, administrator, and parent responsibilities edited and moved to the beginning of the Code
- Expanded rules of conduct: total of 17 infractions expanded to 23 infractions
 - Based on types of offenses coded as disruption of school, we've developed additional rules of conduct (i.e. verbal altercation, physical aggression)

Summary of Recommended Changes

- Expanded infraction levels from 3 to 4
- Replaced Easy Reference Guide for Behavioral Interventions and Disciplinary Action with Behavior Matrix of Infractions, Guidance Interventions, and Disciplinary Actions
- Developed a separate elementary and secondary Code of Conduct

Summary of Recommended Changes: Proposed K-2 Moratorium

2017-2018:

- Expand school-wide positive culture and behavioral supports; progress monitor and make adjustments
- Develop policy and Administrative Regulations regarding moratorium
- K-2 non-violent suspensions discouraged

2018-2019:

K-2 moratorium enacted

Summary of Recommended Changes: Planned Supports


All PPS Schools will be effective schools that support the overall well-being of students. Proposed supports could include:

- High-Functioning Student Assistance Program (SAP)
- Support for Social Workers & Guidance Counselors
- Expanded Nurse Services
- Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS)
- Positive Behavioral Intervention & Supports (PBIS)
- Restorative Practices
- Parent Engagement
- Parent School Community Council (PSCC)
- Out of School Time Opportunities

Summary of Recommended Changes: Planned Supports

Development and alignment of comprehensive school-wide positive behavioral supports are underway:

- Multi-tiered system of support (MTSS)
- Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports (PBIS)
- Restorative Practices
- Social Emotional Learning (SEL) programming and approaches
